

POLICE INFORMATION FOR 03/01/16 – 03/31/16: The incidents indicated below are a summary of the significant investigations conducted by the department during the time period indicated.

NOTE: The IRS scam is now being taken to a higher level: On 03/09/16, the police department was contacted by a resident who reported receiving a telephone call from a male with an accent. The subject stated he was Officer James Williams (badge DC2093). The male told the resident that they would be sending troopers to his home because of a tax dispute. The male provided a call-back telephone number of 215-249-9191. He also told the resident that he could turn himself in at the following address: 3218 Rickert Road, Perkasio, PA. When the investigating officer called the number provided, he learned that the number provided was the telephone number and address are for the Dublin station of the Pennsylvania State Police. However, the station indicated that they do not have an officer by that name, do not have badge numbers that follow that pattern, and do not serve warrants for the IRS.

EAST GOSHEN:

SEXUAL OFFENSE: 03/01/16 - 1700 block of Towne Drive, East Goshen Township – The police department received a CY47 from the Chester County Detectives. The report indicated that a 17 year old female reported being sexually assaulted by a male subject to her counselor. The female stated that the subject used her feet to touch his genitals for sexual pleasure, that the incident was not consensual, and that she repeatedly asked him to stop. The incident occurred after the female victim had a female friend and the subject stay at her house for a sleep-over. Investigation is continuing.

CREDIT CARD FRAUD / IDENTITY THEFT: 03/01/16 – 600 block of Thorncroft Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he received unsolicited credit cards via the mail from Best Buy and Kohl's. When he spoke to customer service for the two companies, he learned that the cards had been opened at two stores in Texas and that the person had charged a total of \$2,572.00 on the cards. The resident indicated that he had traveled to Florida in mid-

February and had left the card at a restaurant. When he realized his mistake 5 to 6 days later and contacted the restaurant, the card was returned to him.

THEFT: 03/01/16 - Saint Peter and Paul Church, Boot Road, East Goshen Township – The church's business manager reported that an unknown subject removed a pink backpack and a cell phone from a coat room inside the church. Several subjects later reported seeing an unknown well-dressed male in his sixties with the backpack on that day.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 03/05/16 - New Kent Apartments, 2607 Barker Circle, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone had entered her unlocked vehicle during the overnight hours and removed the contents of her glove box and console. Stolen items included an I-pod and charging cord (valued at \$200).

SWEEPSTAKES SCAM: 03/07/16 – 1600 block of E. Strasburg Road, East Goshen Township - Resident reported receiving a telephone call from a male subject who advised her that she won twenty-one million dollars and a new BMW automobile. The unidentified man advised the resident to go to her bank and withdraw \$200. He would then stop by her residence to pick up the money and give her the prize. The resident advised that the man had a Jamaican accent and that she knew the call was a scam.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 03/07/16 – 900 block of Rexton Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone entered his unlocked vehicle, which was parked in the residential parking area, and removed several of his belongings. Stolen items included: One (1) prescription pill bottle containing Adderall pills, one (1) prescription pill bottle containing Zolofit pills, one (1) "Hugo Boss" silver and gold watch, and two (2) unknown make, silver cuff links.

SCAM: 03/07/16 – 1100 block of Merrifield Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a suspicious voice mail on her answering machine. The female caller advised her that a "criminal loss" is being filed against her and she would need to contact them immediately. The female further stated that the issue was time sensitive and to contact them immediately or she may receive more severe penalties.

CHECK FRAUD: 03/08/16 - Caleco, 1300 Wilson Drive, East Goshen Township – Company's security manager reported that between the end of February and the beginning of March, numerous withdrawals totaling \$16,506.76 were withdrawn from Caleco's banking account through various fraudulently issued checks. Normally, the company utilizes the account to send checks in small amounts to customers as refund checks. The company became suspicious when it observed checks written for larger amounts (\$476.62 to \$3,462.45). Investigation is continuing.

CREDIT CARD FRAUD: 03/11/16 – Waterview Apartments, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he checked his credit report and observed that there is a past due balance of \$2,386.00 that is due to Verizon under his name and personal information. The fraudulent account with Verizon was established on 12/03/14 and was not made by the resident.

HARASSMENT: 03/11/16 – 2800 block of Eagle Road, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that her husband, her children, and she were harassed by a neighbor the previous

evening. They were outside their residence and the neighbor backed out of his driveway, stopped his vehicle near them, and stared at them for several minutes before giving them the middle finger. Due to the fact that the subject in question was previously cited by the police department in July of 2015 on multiple counts of Harassment and Disorderly Conduct, the investigation is continuing and additional charges may be filed.

DUI CRASH / ARREST: 03/12/16 - Intersection of Paoli Pike and N. Chester Road (SR-352), East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched to the intersection for an accident with injuries. The caller was involved and advised she was in an empty parking lot and was complaining of back pain. The 911 call taker advised that the caller stated she hit something before crashing, but the caller was not answering questions appropriately. Upon arrival at the scene, officers spoke with the driver of the vehicle. At the time, they observed that she displayed possible indications of impairment (unaware of surroundings, unsteady on her feet, fumbling with paperwork, etc.). Due to her injury, the subject was transported to Chester County Hospital for evaluation. Blood was drawn at the hospital to determine drug and alcohol levels; charges pending receipt of the results of the blood analysis.

THEFT: 03/14/16 – Area of Hibberd Lane and Grist Mill Lane, East Goshen Township – President of homeowner's association reported that for the fifth or sixth time, someone has stolen a traffic cone from the intersection. The cones were placed at the intersection and have two small "SLOW" signs fixed to the top of the cones, and are being used to try and slow down the added traffic that has been cutting through the development. The cone with the signs attached cost about \$150. The stolen was later located on East Boot Road in the area of Line Road and Thorncroft and was returned to the subject.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 03/14/16 – 400 block of Barker Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that during the overnight hours someone used a stone to break out the right side small window to the victim's vehicle. Damage is estimated at \$225.

RENTAL SCAM: 03/15/16 - 100 block of Chandler Drive, East Goshen Township – Subject contacted the police department to report a rental scam. The subject stated that he currently lives in Philadelphia and was looking for an apartment in the West Chester area. During his apartment search, the subject went on to the website Apartments.com and entered information into his profile and areas that he was looking to rent. He subsequently began getting text messages and emails from an unknown source who had posted a rental property with an address in the 100 block of Chandler Dr. The subject then began asking for \$800.00 as a deposit and stated that they needed the money immediately to hold the rental. The subject did not provide the subject with any personal information or send money, because he wanted to research the property before committing to anything. When the subject searched the address and learned that the community is a 55+ development, he contacted Hershey's Mill directly to inquire about residences for rent. He was advised by Hershey's Mill that they have been receiving a number of these scams recently and advised him that he did not meet the criteria for rental.

THEFT: 03/15/16 – 300 block of Applebrook Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone had taken six missing wedding bands (total value of approximately \$3,000). The resident indicated that the wedding bands went missing over the course of four years. However, to the best of her knowledge, she doesn't believe that the bands were lost or mislaid. The resident does utilize a cleaning service and has had several contractors in her residence.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 03/15/16 – New Kent Apartments, 2607 Barker Circle, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone had broken off the tailgate handle to his Chevrolet Avalanche. The cost of damage sustained to his vehicle would be in the area of \$300-\$350.

SIMPLE ASSAULT: 03/16/16, Summit Condominiums, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a physical domestic disturbance between a mother and a daughter. Upon arrival, officers observed that the mother had sustained a laceration to her left foot that was bleeding profusely. An ambulance was dispatched to treat the injury. During their investigation, officers determined that the daughter had thrown a ceramic coffee mug at her mother (causing the injury) and had thrown her mother's I Phone 6 (valued at \$500), damaging it to the point that it was inoperable. The daughter was placed under arrest and charged with Simple Assault, Harassment, Criminal Mischief, and Disorderly Conduct.

LEGAL SCAM: 03/16/16 – 3300 block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a suspicious phone call from a male subject, who advised her that she would be taken to court if she did not pay an unknown amount of money. The male indicated he was from Kizard and Koing Law Firm. When the resident "Googled" the law firm, she found that this was a scam.

THEFT: 03/17/16 – Rose Hill Apartments, 1300 block of West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – A resident of the apartments reported that someone had taken several items from her apartment. The resident explained that her apartment was one of the apartments that received smoke damage from the fire that occurred on Friday, 3/11/2016. As a result of the fire, her front door had to be forced open by the fire department. After the fire, she returned to her apartment to retrieve all her valuables and then stayed at a friend's residence until she was allowed back in her apartment. At that time, she observed that a mason jar containing approximate \$30 worth of coins was missing and a Moosehead beer bottle piggy bank containing coins and bills were missing.

IMMIGRATION SCAM: 1000 block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he received a phone call from an anonymous male who stated he was with the "State Police of Pennsylvania". The phone number that showed up on his phone was +1 (911). The male advised that there was a case filed against him for an immigration tax violation in which the police were waiting outside to arrest him. When the resident began to ask questions about the case, he was transferred to a person who claimed to be employed with USCIS (United States Citizenship and Immigration Services). The female directed him to pay \$1,900 immediately or else the case will be taken to court (which would result in a \$21,000 penalty and 7 years in prison). The resident was instructed not tell anyone about this phone call. The resident, who is currently living in the United States on a work visa, advised the callers that he would have to inform his work of this issue. The caller then immediately disconnected.

THEFT: 03/18/16 – 1200 block of Hadleigh Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that the granddaughter of his hired long-time house cleaner is suspected of stealing \$45 in cash from within his home. When confronted today, the suspect fled the house. The grandparents were trying to track her down. The victim advised that a couple have been cleaning his home for the last 15 years. Recently, they began bringing their granddaughter with them to help. The last time they came to clean with her a few weeks ago, a small amount of cash (\$20) was reported missing from one of his daughter's bedrooms. The victim knew that they would be coming on

this date and placed \$45 in cash out in view in one of his children's bedrooms that he knew the granddaughter would be assigned to help clean. After they started cleaning, the victim checked his daughter's bedroom and found the money was missing. He then approached them and asked about the missing money. The granddaughter then fled the house and ran into the woods across the street. The teenager was located and returned to the residence. A discussion was held and the victim determined that he did not want to press charges against the girl. He determined that he would just stop using the family to clean his house and consider the matter closed.

THEFT: 03/19/16 - Area of Hibberd Lane and Grist Mill Lane, East Goshen Township – The police department was notified by the president of the homeowner's association that the traffic cones at the intersection of Grist Mill Ln and Hibberd Ln were stolen again during the overnight hours. Surveillance footage of the intersection indicated that a car turned off its lights and slowed down prior to approaching the intersection. A passenger in the vehicle then reached out and grabbed the cones, before the vehicle drove away. The two traffic cones were later located in the woods along Towne Drive near the intersection of Line Rd and returned to the reporting party.

DUI ARREST: 03/19/16 - Intersection of West Chester Pike and Westtown Way, East Goshen Township – An officer on stationary patrol observed a vehicle that displayed a Pennsylvania registration plate and an expired inspection sticker turn onto westbound West Chester Pike from Westtown Way. The officer stopped the vehicle at the intersection of Reservoir Rd and Park Ave. In speaking with the operator, the officer detected an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle and the driver's breath. Following the administration of field sobriety tests and a PBT, the operator was placed under arrest for DUI. The operator's teenage son, who was present in the vehicle, was transported from the scene by his father. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Jennifer M. WASHCO, F/44, West Chester, PA.**

THEFT: 03/20/16 - Malvern Institute, King Road, East Goshen Township – An officer was dispatched to the Malvern Institute for the report of a theft. The reporting party indicated that her daughter was a patient at the facility and that she was trying to leave against medical advice. She was concerned because she believed that her daughter was in possession of at least one stolen check. Just prior to her daughter checking into rehab, she stole and cashed several checks from her father's business and used the money to purchase drugs. She was concerned that her daughter might repeat the same process after she left the facility. Security officials confirmed that the subject did have one blank company check in her possession when she checked into the rehab center. The check was retrieved and the subject was placed under arrest. Based upon the subject's threat to commit suicide, paperwork for an involuntary mental health commitment was prepared. Crisis intervention advised that the petition was denied; subject released to her parents from the police department.

THEFT: 03/21/16 - Area of Hibberd Lane and Grist Mill Lane, East Goshen Township – President of homeowner's association reported that during the evening hours, someone had stolen the traffic cones again from the intersection. Review of the surveillance footage indicated that the same vehicle involved in the previous theft was involved in this theft.

DUI CRASH / ARREST: 03/23/16 – Waterview Apartments, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched to a report of a crash in the parking lot of the Waterview Apartments. While the officers were enroute, the radio room advised that the vehicle may be

trying to leave the scene and then they advised that a male and female occupant of the vehicle were having a verbal argument. Upon arrival at the scene, it was determined that the vehicle had entered the complex and had traveled straight at the area where the driveway split, jumped a curb, and knocked down a light pole. The property manager, who was on scene, advised that he had observed the driver removing items from the car and placing them in a nearby dumpster after the crash. In speaking with the operator of the vehicle, the officer observed behavioral indications of impairment (slow responses to questions, excessive sleepiness, slurred speech, etc.), fresh needle marks on his arm, and dried vomit on his pants. The officer determined that the subject had an active bench warrant out of Chester County and that his driver's license was DUI suspended. Following the administration of field sobriety tests, the subject was placed under arrest for DUI. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Brendon STIERHEIM, M/36, Spring City, PA.**

SIMPLE ASSAULT: 03/23/16 – 1700 block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – The police department was contacted relative to an assault that had occurred on a school bus. The reporting party indicated that he observed his step-son assaulted as he exited the bus. His son attempted to exit the bus, but the aisle was blocked by the leg of a female student. She refused to move her leg and his step-son was instructed by the aid on the bus to just step over her leg. As he stepped over her leg, she jumped on his back and began punching him in the face and head. The victim suffered a bloody nose, bumps on the head, and scratches to his neck. When he observed the assault occur, he ran on to the bus to help his step-son. At the conclusion of the investigation, charges were filed against the 15 year old female subject.

SWEEPSTAKES SCAM: 03/23/16 - Robynwood Lane, Hershey's Mill, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a phone call from a male caller advising her that she had won the sweepstakes and would be receiving a check for 4.5 million dollars. To claim her prize, the caller advised her that she needed to take a \$450.00 check to Walmart and complete a Walmart to Walmart money transfer with the check (sending the money to Michigan). The resident recognized that the call was a scam and did not send the check.

GRANDPARENT SCAM: 03/23/16 – 1400 block of Linden Lane, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a phone call stating that her nephew had been arrested and in order to get him out of jail, she needed to make a \$2,000 payment. She went to the bank and withdrew that amount to pay the caller, however, was stopped by family beforehand.

CREDIT CARD FRAUD: 03/24/16, Eaton Way, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a call from her bank. The bank advised that a charge on her card in the amount of \$324.94 had just appeared and they were calling to make sure it was approved. She advised the bank that it was a fraudulent charge and asked them to cancel the card.

IRS FRAUD: 03/25/16 – Princeton Lane, East Goshen Township – Resident advised that she learned that she was the victim of identity theft after her accountant attempted to submit her 2015 tax return via e-filing and learned that a return had already been filed using her personal information. The victim indicated that she is an employee with Main Line Health System. Nearly 11,000 Main Line Health employees fell victim to a "spear phishing" scam last month that exposed key personal information, including birth dates and social security numbers.

THEFT: 03/26/16 – 500 block of Westtown Way, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a possible burglary that had just occurred. The resident stated she woke up and observed someone walking out of her room. The person was described as a black female

wearing light colored "Muslim Garb." The resident was confused how the person got into her house as there was a key pad that only the home health care providers and police knew. When she went downstairs, she noticed that her purse was missing. One neighbor stated he was out walking his dog when he saw a white Buick pull up and park in front of the residence. Two females got out of the car and went up to the residence. Another neighbor stated that she saw 2 black females approach the residence. One female was wearing a light gray hoodie and covering her face with another shirt. She thought this was a bit suspicious but did not feel the need to contact the police. The resident indicated that a previous health care provider drove a vehicle which matched the description provided by the neighbors. Investigation is continuing.

DISTURBANCE: 03/28/16 - Malvern Institute, 940 King Rd, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a reported disturbance at the facility. Upon arrival, officers were advised that a male client was refusing to leave the grounds. A supervisor told the officers that the subject became disorderly earlier in the day and then refused to take his medication. Later the subject began to break furniture in his room and wouldn't listen to staff. As a result, the staff advised the client that he would need to leave the property. However, the subject refused to leave the facility. After speaking to the involved parties, the subject was driven to a relative's house by an employee of the facility.

COMPUTER REPAIR SCAM: 3/30/16 – 600 block of Summit House Condominiums, East Goshen Township – Resident indicated that she's been getting calls from a company informing her that her computer is infected with viruses and needs the caller's company to get rid of them. When she informed the subject on the phone that she didn't have a computer, the male became irate and started cursing and yelling at her.

INTERNET SALES SCAM: 03/31/16 – Margo Lane, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she sent a total of \$400.00 to a woman in Clifton, NJ who identified herself as being "Emily Abreu" in exchange for a pair of Yeezys brand oxford tan sneakers. As of this date, the resident has not yet received the sneakers and believes that this was in fact a scam.

HARASSMENT: 03/31/16 – 2700 block of Eagle Road, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a male vs. female domestic disturbance. CCPR advised that the reporting party advised that her ex-boyfriend was at her apartment. He was kicking her front door, covering the peep hole, and yelling at her to open the door. Officers responding to the incident were familiar with the individuals involved due to the previous shift having contact with both. During the previous shift, the male subject had been advised to have no further contact with the female subject. Upon arrival, officers observed the male subject standing outside the building yelling toward the balcony of the apartment. Non-traffic citations for harassment and disorderly conduct were filed against the subject.

WESTTOWN:

THEFT: 03/01/16 – Ardrossan Avenue, Westtown Township – Resident reported that someone had removed some lawn equipment from an unsecured shed in the rear of his property. The first item, a leaf blower, was described as an Echo backpack style leaf blower, mostly black and orange in color (valued at approximately \$350). The second item, a weed whacker, is a Craftsman brand, mostly red in color (valued at less than \$100). The victim did not know when the crime occurred and stated that it may have been any time after Christmas.

TERRORISTIC THREATS: 03/03/16 – Stetson Middle School, Westtown Township – School officials contacted the police department's school officer to request a meeting with a student, a parent, and administration regarding threats. A 6th grade student made various statements to several students indicated that he would bring a weapon to the school and use it. The school officer confirmed with the parent that the student does not have access to a firearm and is being monitored to ensure that he does not bring a knife to school. The school indicated that the student is a special need student who needs assistance when faced with frustrating situations. As a result, the school will be implementing multiple strategies to handle the situation including an aide and classes that provide training in coping mechanisms.

FRAUD: 03/03/16 – 1400 block of Johnny's Way, Westtown Township – Resident reported that someone unsuccessfully attempted to open an account in his name at Target and Macy's. The resident, who is employed as a doctor at Lankenau Medical Center, reported that his personal information was compromised during a recent breach of the Main Line Health information systems.

SCAM: 03/04/16 – 1500 block of Woodland Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that he received a telephone call from an unknown male caller who advised him that he had won some money in a sweepstakes. In order to claim the prize, the resident was directed to send a finder's fee to Jamaica. The resident recognized the call was a scam and hung up.

SCAM: 03/05/16 – 1500 block of Woodland Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that, for the second day in a row, he received multiple scam calls from unknown persons in Jamaica. Due to the fact that the resident had been scammed into sending \$4,500 to Canada a few weeks ago, direction on blocking unwanted calls was given to the family.

ROAD RAGE: 03/05/16 – Southbound Rt. 202 near Rt. 926, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a disturbance/road rage incident. The reporting party advised that while traveling southbound on Rt. 202 and stopped at the light at Rt. 926, the driver of a dark "Turbo" Hatchback sped up from behind him and began screaming at him. The subject then got out of his car at the traffic light, approached him and his family, and threatened to break his jaw. The subject reentered his vehicle and left when the light turned green. Based upon the information provided by the reporting party, officers were able to locate the driver. The driver indicated that the reporting party's vehicle failed to yield while merging from Pleasant Grove Road onto southbound Rt. 202. As a result, he swerved into the left lane in order to avoid an accident, then back into the right lane in order to position himself in front of the other vehicle. Once stopped at the light at southbound 202 and 926, he advised that he exited his vehicle and began "yelling at the driver". The reporting party was contacted again; he advised that he did not want to pursue charges against the other driver in part due to the age of the driver. Case closed.

THEFT: 03/06/16 – 1500 block of Manley Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that upon returning from a vacation, she discovered that two oversized Adirondack chairs were missing from their rear porch. The chairs have an estimated value of \$500.00 each.

DUI ARREST: 03/06/16 – Southbound Rt. 202 at the merger with Wilmington Pk., Westtown Township – An officer on routine patrol in a marked car was passed by a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed by another vehicle. The officer clocked the vehicle for approximately 3/4 of a mile and determined that the vehicle was traveling at 65 MPH in the clearly posted 45 MPH

zone. Additionally, the officer observed the vehicle to seemingly bounce off of the center dividing line toward the center median several times. The vehicle was stopped on Martingale Road. Upon speaking with the driver, the officer detected indications of impairment (strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath and person, slurred speech, etc.). Following the administration of field sobriety tests and a PBT test, the operators was placed under arrest for DUI. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Moira K. LARKIN, F/24, Chester Heights, PA.**

HARASSMENT BY COMMUNICATION: 03/07/16 – Ponds Edge Road, Westtown Township - Resident reported that he has been receiving text messages from a female subject and he no longer wants to have contact with her. He stated that on two occasions during the past, he had sexual relations with the female subject. Beginning of January of 2016, she began contacting him and asking him to pay a total of \$990.00 for an abortion that she had as a result of those relations. The female subject was contacted and confirmed the resident's version of events. She was advised to seek legal advice and handle the matter in civil court should she decide to go that route, but she had to cease all contact with the resident.

ALARM COMPANY SCAM: 03/09/16 – 1000 block of Ashley Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that she received a telephone call from a female subject who identified herself as being employed by ADT Security. The female caller was asking questions about the resident's current ADT security system. When the resident asked questions about the caller regarding her identity, the caller disconnected. The resident then called ADT directly and reported what had happened. ADT advised that they did not contact her with these questions, and that they would notify their fraud department of this incident.

ROAD RAGE: 03/09/16 – Southbound Rt. 202 at Skiles Boulevard, Westtown Township – Officers conducting commercial vehicle inspections observed subjects from three separate vehicles yelling profanities and honking horns at each other. Then, one individual exited his vehicle and began to walk toward one of the other involved vehicles and the officers intervened. All of the involved parties were directed to the entrance of Stetson School to resolve the issue. Each of the three drivers provided a different version of what occurred. Since the original event occurred at Matlack Street, which is in West Goshen Township, the three parties were advised to contact with that police department if they wanted to pursue charges against any of the other drivers. However, each involved party was strongly counseled about their actions and how they contributed to the incident.

WARRANT SERVICE: 03/10/16 – Heather Glen Apartments, West Chester Pike, Westtown Township – The police department was contacted by New Jersey law enforcement officials and advised of an urgent hit confirmation. A resident of the apartment complex, with whom the police department had had contact, was wanted out of the Middlesex County Prosecutors Office in New Jersey with nationwide extradition for failing to appear for a pre-arraignment hearing for a gun charge. Later that same day, the subject was taken into custody without incident in a vehicle parked outside his apartment.

WARRANT SERVICE: 03/10/16 – Intersection of West Chester Pike and Rt. 352, Westtown Township – An officer was on routine patrol and was monitoring traffic at the intersection, when his automatic license plate reader indicated that a vehicle with a suspended registration due to insurance cancellation had just passed his vehicle. He stopped the vehicle at West Chester Pike and Stoneham Drive. After speaking to the driver, the officer confirmed that there was a

non-traffic warrant for the subject. The driver was arrested and transported to District Court 15-1-02 to await arraignment.

CREDIT FRAUD: 03/11/16 – Oakbourne Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that she received a letter from PayPal, advising her that they detected suspicious activity on an account that was recently opened in her name. She contacted PayPal to let them know that she did not open a new account and advise them that she has not used her legitimate account in over a year. PayPal advised her that on 03/03/16 a purchase in the amount of \$51.00 was attempted to be charged to this fraudulent account but was stopped due to it being suspicious.

TERRORISTIC THREATS: 03/11/16 – Stetson Middle School, Westtown Township – School officials contacted the department's school officer regarding a female 7th grade student who threatened a teacher. The incident occurred when the student refused to comply with her teacher's directives in class. The student then picked up a stapler and raised it over the teacher's head stating, "I'm going to hit you with this". The student then picked up a pair of scissors and held it in a threatening manner before the teacher removed the scissors from her hand. The student was subsequently escorted to the main office. The school will be suspending the student pending a hearing, which could lead to a longer suspension.

THEFT: 03/14/16 – 1400 block of Johnny's Way, Westtown Township – Resident reported that she parked her vehicle in the front parking lot of Penn Wood Elementary School at 0745 hours. Around lunchtime, a parent reported to the office that the left rear window of her car had been broken out. When she checked her car, she observed that her black Coach handbag was taken from behind the driver's seat. Inside the handbag was a tan and brown Coach wallet that contained several credit cards including a Capital One Visa, Home Depot Credit Card, Lowes Credit Card, and a Sunoco Gas Card. Prior to the victim cancelling the cards, one of the cards had been used for a \$24.03 transaction at the Wawa store on Baltimore Pike in Glen Mills.

THEFT OF VEHICLE: 03/15/16 – Jefferson at Westtown Apartments, Skiles Boulevard, Westtown Township - Resident reported that his motorcycle was stolen from the complex's parking lot during the overnight hours. The resident stated that he last saw his motorcycle parked in front of the 1500 building last night (Monday 3/14/16) at approximately 2300 hours and discovered that it was missing the following morning at 0730 hours. He further added that he is still in possession of the vehicle's keys and it has no "E-ZPass" in or on it. When asked if it could have been repossessed, the resident stated that he owns the bike outright. The motorcycle was described as a 2006 Honda CVR 600 RR orange in color with black trim and orange rims. The bike was last bearing FL registration 3242NR. Vehicle was entered into NCIC as stolen.

THEFT OF VEHICLE: 03/15/16 - Jefferson at Westtown Apartments, Skiles Boulevard, Westtown Township – A second resident reported that his motorcycle was stolen from the complex's parking lot during the overnight hours. The motorcycle was described as a 2011 Lime green colored Kawasaki ZX-6R bearing PA registration K8475.

ESCAPE: 03/15/16 – Gaudenzia House, 1030 S. Concord Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a court-ordered client who left the facility. The subject, a 21 year old female who is three months pregnant, left the facility without the permission of the facility. She was last seen on foot southbound on South Concord Road toward Westbourne Road. As officers were searching for the subject, a resident in the 300 block of E. Pleasant

Grove Road reported that the female was at her residence. As the officer's traveled to the address, the female left that location but was later returned to the facility. Due to the circumstances, it was determined that the subject would stay at the facility overnight and her probation officer would be notified in the morning.

ESCAPE: 03/17/16 - Gaudenzia House, 1030 S. Concord Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a court-ordered client who left the facility. The subject, a 30 year old female, had climbed out of a window at the facility and was seen walking off the property heading towards E. Pleasant Grove Road. Officers were unable to locate the subject and advised the subject's parole officer about the escape.

SIMPLE ASSAULT: 03/18/16 – Stetson Middle School, Westtown Township – The police department was contacted by school officials relative to a fight that had occurred between two students. The investigation indicated that two male students, who were in a computer lab class together, became involved in a fight after one student allegedly made inappropriate comments/jokes. One student punched the other student in the back of the head. The student who had punched the other was suspended by the school for his behavior.

SWEEPSTAKES SCAM: 03/19/16 – 1500 block of Woodland Road, Westtown Township – An officer was dispatched to the Giant Food Store at 1502 West Chester Pike to speak with the victim of a potential scam. Upon arrival, the officer spoke with a store employee who stated that she has been assisting a resident of Westtown Township over the last few months with sending Western Union payments to different people. This morning, the resident arrived and indicated that he wanted to send a \$100.00 payment to an unknown person. When she advised him that he should not send money to people he didn't know, he became upset and left the store. The employee stated that he seemed like he was confused and was concerned that he was being taken advantage of. She provided the resident's name and address. In speaking with the resident, the officer learned that the resident received a telephone call in March from an unknown male subject who advised that he just won 1.8 million dollars and that he would need to send him \$500.00 to collect the winnings. On March 18, 2016, he sent \$100.00 to the subject in Jamaica via Western Union from the Giant Food Store located in the Westtown Market Place. After receiving a second call from the subject, he returned to the store and sent another \$100. The resident was advised that the calls were a scam and he should block the numbers and consider changing his phone number (due to the fact that the victim has been repeatedly victimized through scams in the past). Additionally, the officer contacted a family member to obtain additional support/assistance for the victim in ending the victimization.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 03/19/16 – 1000 block of Russell Lane, Westtown Township – Resident reported that unknown actor(s) threw dog feces at his front door during the overnight hours. He also advised that there was also what looked to be a small piece of a paper bag that had been burned.

TRESPASSING: 03/20/16 - St. Simon and Jude Church, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched to the church for a disturbance. The reporting party, a church parishioner, stated a female attending mass was harassing the priest and refusing to leave. The reporting party stated that the priest may have a "restraining order" against the female in question. In order to avoid disturbing the mass (which was already under way), the officers waited in an adjacent hallway while ushers brought the female out. The subject, who was known to the officers from other contacts, was reminded that she was instructed a few months prior that she was no longer

welcome at the church. The subject stated that she simply wanted to be "blessed" by the priest. She feared if she didn't get blessed, she would not get into heaven. The subject was escorted from the church's property and the officer will be following with the church to determine what course of action should be pursued.

RENTAL SCAM: 03/20/16 – 1500 block of Overhill Road, Westtown Township – Resident indicated that she came across an advertisement on Craigslist for a home listed for rent in Havertown. The post did not have the home's physical address, but the person who posted this listing was asking \$800.00 a month for rent. When she contacted the person listing the property by email, she received an email back from the "poster" requesting that she complete a credit application. She filled out that application and sent it to the listing person. Throughout the day, her suspicions began to rise so she contacted a friend. The friend researched the house, located the listing agent, and discovered that the house has continually been used for online scams.

IRS FRAUD: 03/21/16 – Hinchley Run, Westtown Township – Residents reported that they were contacted by their accountant, who advised that he was unable to file their taxes because someone else had already fraudulently "e-filed" their taxes.

IRS FRAUD: 03/21/16 – Cockburn Drive, Westtown Township – Resident reported that he discovered that someone had fraudulently filed an income tax return using his and his wife's social security numbers when he tried to file their income tax return.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 03/23/16 – Stanton Avenue, Westtown Township – Resident reported that someone vandalized her mailbox/post during the overnight hours, and that this is the second time in 2 months that her mailbox has been damaged. She indicated that she discovered the mailbox and its post were destroyed and that mail had been scattered all over the yard when she left her home. Approximate damage estimated at \$100.

THEFT: 03/26/16 - 2700 block of Whittleby Court, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of several subjects attempting to enter vehicles. Upon arrival at the scene, the officers located three subjects standing near a vehicle in the cul-de-sac. Their investigation revealed that the three subjects were attending a party in the area. One of the subject wandered away from the group and began to steal from unlocked vehicles parked along the street. He returned to the group stolen items (including a camera and accessories, loose change, etc.). The subject was charged with Theft from an Automobile, Theft by Unlawful Taking, Receiving Stolen Property, Loitering and Prowling at Night and Public Drunkenness.

DISTURBANCE: 03/30/16 – Stetson Middle School, Westtown Township – School officials contacted the police department to report a disturbance involving a 7th grade student that had occurred at the school. The female student, who had just returned to school after a 10 day suspension, refused to follow the directions of the staff members. She walked around the main office, then entered a school official's office and began going through the personal items of the official. When they attempted to redirect her out of the office, she used her body to push past staff members. The school will be imposing additional internal sanctions against the student.

IRS FRAUD: 03/30/16 – Baywood Road, Westtown Township – Residents reported that they received a letter from the Internal Revenue Service advising that a tax return had been fraudulently submitted on line for them using their personal information. The wife indicated that

she was advised in March by her employer, GlaxoSmithKline that a security breach of employee data occurred to many of their employees.

SEXUAL OFFENSE: 03/31/16 – Rustin High School, Westtown Township – The police department received a Child Abuse Report from Chester County Detectives. The report was filed by a teacher at the school who reported that a 26 year old female had advised him that she had been touched in a sexual manner by a male teacher while attending the school 8 years ago. The female indicated that the teacher put his hands around her waist and did not remove them, even after the student told him that it made her uncomfortable. When the victim was contacted, she indicated that she did not want the incident investigated.

THORNBURY:

COMPUTER REPAIR SCAM: 03/01/16 – 600 block of Woodbine Road, Thornbury Township – Resident reported that he received a phone call from an unknown male caller with an accent advising him that he needed a new "mother board" for his computer. The resident indicated that he knew the call was a scam because he has not used his computer in a long time and hung up.

DISTURBANCE: 03/02/16 –Bridlewood Boulevard and Stone Fence Road, Thornbury Township – The police department was contacted by the school officials at Starkweather Elementary School regarding a disturbance involving a 5th grade student that had occurred. School officials advised that a dark colored pick-up truck stopped in the road while a student was crossing the street at Bridlewood Boulevard and Stone Fence Road and began yelling profanities at the student. The student ignored the subject and continued to her bus stop. As other students and an adult were waiting for the bus to arrive, the truck returned. The driver began to question the students and adult about where the student lived so that he could speak with her parents. When the bus arrived, the subject stepped on to the bus and spoke with the driver. Based upon the conversations, it appeared that the subject wanted to speak to someone about the female student because she had walked out into the road, directly into his path. He had lost his temper and yelled at her because she had frightened him badly.

THEFT: 03/02/16 – 700 block of S. Westbourne Road, Thornbury Township – Resident reported that someone had entered her unlocked vehicle during the overnight hours and removed approximately three dollars in change from the console area. She was alerted to the theft when she exited her residence and found that the trunk to her vehicle was open.

THEFT: 03/15/16 - Calista Grand Salon and Spa in the Commons at Thornbury Shopping Center, Thornbury Township – Employee of the business reported that someone entered her unlocked personal vehicle, which was parked to the rear of the business, and removed items that were owned by the business (which were in her vehicle due to a show that she had attended). The items were described as two black vinyl bags on wheels (valued at \$40 each); each bag contained shampoo, conditioner, hair spray and other styling products (valued at \$50 each bag).

RETAIL THEFT: 03/22/16 – Giant Food Store, Dilworthtown Crossing, Thornbury Township – Asset Protection Manager reported that three days prior, he observed two subjects walking around the store who were acting in a suspicious manner. He approached the subjects and confronted them, stating "I know what you are doing. You can leave the items that you have and

you can leave the store". The subjects left the store without incident. He later learned that the same two subjects may have been involved in a theft that occurred on March 19th. Both subjects (who were wearing the same clothes) entered the store and then removed multiple DVDs without paying for them. The female subject is described as a white female wearing a blue denim jacket, pink shirt, a black shoulder purse, and jeans. The male subject is described as a white male, wearing a camouflage jacket, jeans, and a black baseball cap.

IRS FRAUD: 03/22/16 – Sidesaddle Place, Thornbury Township – Resident reported that he received a letter from the Internal Revenue Service advising him that someone had fraudulently filed a tax return under his name and social security number.

REPAIR FRAUD: 03/29/16 – Chaps Lane, Thornbury Township – Resident reported that she contacted General Electric in early February to repair her dishwasher. When the repairman finished the job, he charged her \$150.00. When the victim paid the repairman with a personal check, the man asked that she make the check out to "CASH". As a result, she made the check out to cash and gave it to the repairman. A few weeks later, her dishwasher broke down again. When the victim contacted G.E., they advised her that they had no record of her previous repair visit. She made G.E. aware of the incident and scheduled another repair. The work was completed by another repairman and she was not charged for the work.
