

POLICE INFORMATION FOR 06/01/16 – 06/15/16: *The incidents indicated below are a summary of the significant investigations conducted by the department during the time period indicated.*

IRS/TREASURY DEPARTMENT SCAM (Caller fraudulently claims that the victim has failed to pay taxes and that the IRS/Treasury Department has issued an arrest warrant and will be serving it immediately, unless the victim makes electronic payment):

EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP:

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 06/01/16 – 900 block of Brookmont Circle, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that at approximately 0415 hours, he heard noises coming from outside his home on his street. When he went to investigate, he observed an unknown make/model (possibly a dark colored vehicle) coming down his street hitting mailboxes, including his own. The vehicle then fled the area. Damage to his mailbox was estimated at \$50.00. Similar vandalism was also noted on other nearby streets.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 06/01/16 – 100 block of Rossmore Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that at approximately 0406 hours, a vehicle came down her street and was damaging mailboxes. Damage to her mailbox was estimated at \$50.00.

DRUG VIOLATION: 06/01/16 – E. Boot Road, East Goshen Township – An officer on routine patrol observed a vehicle pull into a small parking lot across from the Bellingham Retirement Facility. As the officer drove by the parking lot, the vehicle shut its headlights off and parked in the far corner. After approximately 5 minutes lapsed and there was no activity within the vehicle, the officer drove past the vehicle and observed two young male occupants inside. During the subsequent investigation, it was determined that both the passenger and the driver were in possession of contraband: a pipe and a bong for smoking marijuana, a grinder for marijuana, 3 Budweiser unopened beer cans, 1 half emptied bottle of Rum, 2 empty glass mason jars with suspected marijuana residue, 1 black "AWS" scale with a green leafy substance inside, and 1 Ziploc baggie box. Investigation is continuing, pending the filing of charges.

DISTURBANCE: 06/02/16 – Malvern Institute, 940 King Road, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a fight between an individual (who was attempting to leave the facility) and her daughter. Upon arrival, the officer spoke with the subjects. The daughter advised that her mother was attempting to admit herself to the facility but her vitals were too high due to being extremely intoxicated. The daughter explained that the facility could not accept her with her vitals being so high and that she would need to be medically cleared before she could be admitted. When her mother was told this, she became very argumentative with her daughter. A verbal argument ensued between mother and daughter until police arrived. The officers explained the process again to the mother and she began to calm down. Malvern EMS arrived on location and transported her to Paoli Hospital to be evaluated by doctors.

DRUG VIOLATION: 06/03/16 – 500 block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – Detectives were advised of possible drug activity in a specific apartment. Upon arrival at the apartment, the detectives made contact with a resident of the apartment outside the apartment in the hallway. After explaining to her why police were on scene, she was asked if the police could enter her residence to search for drugs. After providing consent, the resident told the detectives that the drugs were located on the kitchen counter in a basket, and on the dining room table. A small glass pipe was located on the dining room table, a grinder, and small clear bag containing a small amount of green leafy substance was located in the basket. The subject was informed she was going to be taken into custody and to find someone to care for her two daughters. Her father responded to the residence and took custody of the two children.

CREDIT CARD FRAUD: 06/04/16 – New Kent Apartments, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he became aware that he was the victim of credit card fraud when he tried to use his Public Federal Credit Union (PFECU) Visa debit card that and it was declined at two area stores. He then contacted the credit union by phone and found that his card was suspended due to three suspected fraudulent charges. The victim confirmed that the three charges were not authorized and included the following: a charge at the Upper Darby Wash and Lube; a charge at the Sunoco in Aldan, PA; and a charge at the Wawa Store in Lansdowne, PA.

FRAUD: 06/08/16 – QVC, 1365 Enterprise Drive, East Goshen Township – QVC official reported that an unknown subject(s) had hacked into their database and compromised the accounts of several customers, using the accounts in an attempt to have fraudulent purchases shipped to an address in Wilmington, DE. In the majority of the cases, the company was able to detect the fraudulent activity before the order was shipped. However, in 5 cases, the items were mailed out and the customer's QVC credit cards were charged. The five fraudulent charges were for 2 Apple iPhone 6s, 2 Apple MacBooks, and a cold pack item for a total of \$5,848.94. The customers were notified of the security breach and the investigation is continuing.

ATTEMPTED BURGLARY: 06/10/16 – 400 block of Gateswood Drive, East Goshen Township – Two residents reported that someone had entered and/or broken into their sheds during the overnight hours but nothing appeared to have been stolen. However, in one incident, it appears that the actors damaged the doors of the shed.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 06/10/16 – New Kent Apartments, Rexton Drive, East Goshen Township – Multiple residents reported that someone entered their unlocked vehicles during the overnight hours and ransacked them. One vehicle had approximately \$10.00 in loose change removed. Management of the complex was requested to notify residents of the situation.

DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE: 06/10/16 – 1300 block of West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for the report of a domestic disturbance in front of a business in the 1300 block of West Chester Pike. The dispatchers advised that the subjects were inside a white Dodge Caravan in the parking lot. Upon arrival at the scene, the subjects were interviewed by the officers. The male subject stated that he and his girlfriend were involved in a heated argument while driving on West Chester Pike. The argument got so bad, he decided to pull over and call the police. He stated that the argument was verbal only and that there was no physical contact between the two. The female subject stated that during the verbal argument, her boyfriend slammed on the brakes of the vehicle with the intention of having another vehicle strike them. When that was unsuccessful, he pulled into the parking lot and exited the vehicle. She also stated that there was no physical contact during this argument although there have been physical confrontations between them in the past. The officer checked both subjects for warrants and did find that there was a temporary PFA in which the male subject was listed as the protected party against the female subject. The female subject stated she had been served with a PFA but believed that the order had been lifted since neither party went to a hearing over the matter. Based upon this information, the female subject was taken into custody for violating the PFA order.

ATTEMPTED THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 06/10/16 - 1000 block of Rexton Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone entered her unlocked vehicle during the overnight hours and ransacked it. She became aware of the incident when she entered her vehicle in the morning and observed that the contents from inside the glove box were scattered about the vehicle and that the trunk was also ransacked.

ATTEMPTED THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 06/10/16 – 600 block of Marydell Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that her and her husband's unlocked vehicles were entered during the overnight hours and ransacked. However, nothing was taken from either vehicle.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 06/11/16 – New Kent Apartments, Rexton Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported someone entered his unlocked vehicle (apparently during the overnight hours) and removed one pair of men's black Ray ban sunglasses (valued at \$200.00 dollars). Additionally, the subject pulled out the lock for glove compartment but no access was gained into the compartment (the value to replace the lock is estimated to be \$200.00 dollars).

THEFT: 06/11/2016 – 1500 block of Bancroft Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone entered his unlocked shed and removed an Echo gas power trimmer.

THEFT: 06/11/2016 – 600 block of Marydell Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone forced entry into his shed (damaging the double doors, estimated value of damage is \$200.00) and then removed one of three bicycles that was inside. The bicycle, a Trek adult mountain bike, white in color with a 21 or 22 inch frame was valued at \$200.00 dollars.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 06/11/16 - 600 block of Marydell Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone entered her unlocked vehicle, which was parked in her driveway, during the last 2 days and removed several items. The items stolen included: owner's card for vehicle, insurance card and son's learners permit (estimated value of missing items was \$15.00 dollars).

DUI ARREST: 06/12/16 – E. Boot Road, East Goshen Township – An officer on routine patrol observed a vehicle traveling on Boot Road that did not have any operating taillights. The officer began to follow the vehicle and observed the vehicle commit numerous traffic violations (crossing over the double yellow lines, speeding, failing to dim headlights upon approach of oncoming traffic, etc.). The vehicle was subsequently stopped in front of the entrance to the Village Square Shopping Center located in the 1300 block of Boot Road. Upon approaching the vehicle, the officer observed one partially full beer bottle and one empty beer bottle in the center console cup holders and another empty beer bottle on the floor in the back seat area. In speaking to the driver, the officer observed indications of impairment (slurred speech, blood shot eyes, etc.). Following the administration of field sobriety tests and a PBT, the driver was placed under arrest for DUI. While the officer was placing the driver under arrest, the back-up officer observed the passenger attempting to place something down the front of his pants. The object was removed and determined to be an Advil bottle that had some suspected controlled substance in it. **ARRESTED SUBJECTS: Daniel MATTHEWS, M/25, Holtwood, PA – DUI; passenger charged with Possession of Controlled Substance and Drug paraphernalia.**

GRANDPARENT SCAM: 06/13/16 – Eaton Way, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a phone call from someone who stated he was her grandson and that he was arrested by NYPD. The resident immediately recognized that the call was a scam because her grandson resides in Florida and hung up on the caller. She then called her grandson immediately after disconnecting with the caller to confirm that he was alright and not in New York.

PENSION SCAM (NEW VERSION): 06/14/16 – Troon Lane, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a telephone message from a male caller with a foreign accent. The caller advised her that that she would need to report to a Magistrate Court for her pension. The resident knew that this call was a scam and did not respond to the message.

THEFT: 06/14/16 – 400 block of Barker Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that the lamp post that was positioned at the end of his driveway was stolen

during the overnight hours. The actor(s) cut the wires and ripped the lamp post out of the ground; estimated cost to replace the lamp is approximately \$250.00.

DUI CRASH / ARREST: 06/14/16 – N. Chester Road, south of Boot Road, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a hit and run crash that had just occurred. The caller advised that a blue BMW stopped abruptly, causing him to rear end the vehicle. Both parties got out of their vehicles and an argument ensued. The verbal exchange was very brief and then the female operator of the BMW drove off, leaving the accident scene. The caller stated that the female driver was slurring her words and could possibly be intoxicated. Approximately 5 minutes after the initial report of the hit and run accident, the female party called 911 to report that she had been in an accident in which she had been rear ended by another vehicle. Within minutes of receiving the second call, officers responded to the address of the female caller. The female subject greeted the officers wearing the same clothing described by the initial caller. The officer detected indications of impairment in speaking with the female (disheveled clothing, odor of an alcoholic beverage, poor balance, slurred speech, etc.). Following the administration of field sobriety tests and a PBT, the subject was placed under arrest for DUI. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Ashley WEIDOW, F/31, West Chester, PA.**

ALLEGED CHILD ABUSE: 06/15/16 – YMCA, Airport Road, East Goshen Township – An employee of the YMCA indicated that a mother entered the family lockers near the outdoor pool with two children and a baby. While the family was inside, the employee could hear the children screaming and the children being hit. The employee indicated that the mother was heard telling the children to stop crying and to behave, but the slapping seemed to be very loud. The family was identified and the investigation is continuing.

DRUG VIOLATION: 06/15/16 – East Goshen Park, 1661 Paoli Pike, East Goshen Township – An officer on routine patrol observed a parked, occupied vehicle that was parked in the East Goshen Park at 2232 hours. Upon approaching the car and speaking with the driver, the officer observed that the driver was extremely nervous and fidgeting and that his eyes were glassy and bloodshot. Additionally the officer detected the odor of burnt marijuana coming from the interior of the car. After the driver produced a clear Ziploc bag containing four nuggets of a brownish green vegetable matter and a four inch glass pipe, he was arrested and charged with possessing a small amount of marijuana.

BURGLARY: 06/15/16 – 2700 block of Eagle Road, East Goshen Township - Resident reported that someone had entered his apartment and removed several items. He discovered the burglary when he returned to his apartment after being gone only two hours and found the front door of his apartment unlocked. As he entered his apartment, he discovered that the 50 inch Samsung LCD flat screen TV was missing. He then observed that both of the bedrooms were ransacked and that someone had stolen his collection of Air Jordan sneakers. Ten pairs of sneakers with an average price of 250.00 were taken. Additionally, one of the boxes contained \$560.00 (his rent money). Further investigation indicated that forced entry had been made on the front door.

WESTTOWN TOWNSHIP:

SEXUAL OFFENSE: 06/01/16 – Rustin High School, 1100 Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – School official contacted the police department to advise that a female student had reported that a male student had pressured two female students into sending him photos of themselves either naked or wearing only their undergarments. A meeting was held with the students and the parents of the involved students; they were advised that both the sender and the recipient of the photos could be charged with the crime of "transmission of sexually explicit images by a minor". All parties indicated that the activity would cease and that the male student would apologize to the two female students. No further action taken.

DISTURBANCE: 06/02/16 – Rustin High School, 1100 Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – School officials reported that two male students had engaged in a mutual fight inside a school bathroom. Although both students indicated that the fight was primarily verbal, they both also admitted that they had thrown a punch at the other student. The matter was handled internally by the school, with both students have a suspension imposed on them.

ENDANGERED MISSING PERSON: 06/02/16 – Jeroma Lane, Westtown Township – The resident reported that she was unable to locate her adult son and was concerned for his wellbeing due to previous problems with alcohol abuse. Additionally, she reported a pattern of erratic behavior. She became concerned when she discovered that her son was missing from the residence along with several bottles of wine and champagne. The officer completed a search of the residence with negative results. Due to the perceived risk to the individual, a canine unit was called to the residence to perform a search. The canine began to track a scent to the rear of the residence. As the search continued, the dog was able to locate several items of discarded clothing which belonged to the missing person. While searching the perimeter of the residence the dog lost track of the scent. It was agreed an additional canine unit would be called in to ensure that nothing was missed. While awaiting the arrival of the second canine unit, the officer heard a male subject calling from an adjacent yard. At this time the officers located the missing person, nude and covered with abrasions from falling. The subject was transported to Chester County Hospital for treatment and evaluation, and the alcohol was recovered from a nearby shrub.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 06/03/16 – Supplee Way, Westtown Township – Resident reported that someone had thrown a single egg at the side of his house and then fled the scene in a small SUV, traveling east on Cheyney Drive.

DUI ARREST: 06/04/16 - Wilmington Pike, Westtown Township - An officer monitoring traffic in the area of Wilmington Pike at Robins Nest Lane, observed a vehicle traveling south on Wilmington Pike that had a head light and tail light out. The officer performed a traffic stop on the vehicle. As the officer made contact with the driver he observed indications of impairment (an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle, eyes that were red and glassy, etc.). When asked about the smell, the offender denied having smoked

any marijuana. At that time, the officer asked the offender to step out of the vehicle. When the officer performed a pat down search he discovered several home-made lollipops. The driver confirmed that the lollipops contained THC, but did not acknowledge that he had ingested any. The offender was taken in custody for suspected DUI and possession of a controlled substance. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Jarrett BENOIT, M/20, West Chester, PA**

DUI CRASH / ARREST: 06/04/16 - Northbound Wilmington Pike, south of E. Pleasant Grove Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a single vehicle accident in which the car struck a pole. The caller advised the dispatcher that the pole was split and that the driver was out of the vehicle, walking around. Upon their arrival at the scene, officers spoke with the driver. He indicated he was driving north on Wilmington Pike when he looked down at the radio and sneezed. He then lost control of his vehicle and crashed head-on into the telephone pole, which was on the right side of the roadway. While speaking with the driver, the officer observed indications of impairment (speech that was slightly slurred, red and glassy eyes, and an odor of an alcoholic beverage was coming from his breath and person). Following the administration of field sobriety tests and a PBT, the subject was placed under arrest for DUI. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Joseph M. FREEMAN, M/23, North Wildwood, NJ.**

TRESPASSING: 06/05/16 – Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a suspicious condition, in which an SUV was seen stuck in a drainage ditch at the construction site. Upon their arrival at the scene, officers observed a Toyota SUV that was stuck in a drainage ditch with a white male standing next to it. The subject originally stated he parked at the construction site to go for a walk around Rustin High School when he attempted to turn around but accidentally drove into the ditch. After several minutes of questioning, he admitted to lying to police and that his intentions were to go "off-roading" but he got stuck while exiting the area. The subject was issued two citations; one for Trespass by Motor Vehicle and Operation of Vehicle Without Inspection. He was further advised that police will contact the construction site foreman tomorrow and if any damage is located he will be cited for criminal mischief as well.

THEFT: 06/06/16 – Stetson Middle School, Westtown Township – School officials reported that they received information from a teacher regarding a student stealing numerous stationery items from his teachers. A search of the student's locker revealed numerous markers, a white board (12"), a pencil sharpener, cleaner, and sharpie pens. The school indicated that it would handle the matter internally and the student would be suspended.

THEFT/CREDIT CARD FRAUD: 06/06/16 - Dunvegan Road, Westtown Township – Police received reports of a theft of a credit card with subsequent fraudulent use. The victim reported that on the previous day he has used his credit card to purchase an Uber ride from the Philadelphia International Airport, and that this was the last time he had seen his credit cards. Later that day, when attempting to make a purchase he discovered his credit cards were missing. When he called to cancel the cards, he was informed that the cards were used to make multiple fraudulent purchases from stores in

Glen Mills, including a Samsung TV and an I-Pad. The victim advised that the accounts have since been cancelled and new cards have been issued. Officers later made contact with the stores loss prevention programs to obtain video footage of the fraudulent purchases. Investigation is ongoing.

ALLEGED SEXUAL ABUSE OF CHILD: 06/07/16 - St. Simon and Jude School, 6 Cavanaugh Court, Westtown Township – Detectives received a suspected child abuse report from a teacher at St. Simon and Jude School. The teacher reported that a child had come to her about another student that had been following him around at school. He additionally reported that the student had touched “his privates” while he was using the bathroom. Officers responded to the school to follow up on the reports. Upon arrival officers spoke with the school officials regarding the alleged child abuse. The officials advised that the complainant had reported being followed around by another student, but that the reports about the sexual nature of the events had been conflicted. The officers contacted the parents of both students about the allegations. The mother of the complainant advised that her son had come to her about several inappropriate comments of a sexual nature that the other student had made to him. When interviewed, the student reported that the other boy often made sexual comments to him in a joking manner and had attempted to touch him while he was urinating, but had never made contact. The other student was interviewed and reported that he had made some comments of a sexual nature, but had never made any contact with his privates. The staff and parents reported that they would monitor the situation and report any additional issues to the authorities.

DRUG VIOLATION: 06/07/16 – Rustin High School, 1100 Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – School officials reported that a male student was found to be in possession of a small amount of marijuana. The staff was looking into the report of a marijuana odor coming from a stairwell during 6th period, and discovered that one student was telling other students he was smoking marijuana around 6th period. A search of the student’s belongings revealed two cigarillos with suspected marijuana inside.

THEFT: 06/08/16 – 1100 Block of Fielding Drive, Westtown Township – Officers received report of theft. A walk in complainant reported to officers that two rings that belonged to her grandparents were missing from her jewelry box. She advised that movers were recently in her residence to remove several items, but she had not observed them enter the area that contained the jewelry box. Investigation is continuing.

DOG BITE: 06/09/16 – Garden Circle, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched in reference to a delayed report of a dog bite. Contact was made with the complainant who reported that her son was recently bitten by a large boxer while visiting friend’s house. The victim sustained a large bite on the thigh which required treatment at a local Urgent Care. Officers spoke with the owner of the dog and obtained vaccination information, etc.

IDENTITY THEFT: 06/10/16 – S. Chester Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that his Social Security Number had been used to open a bank account. The resident advised that he received a form letter from Wells Fargo advising him of a law

change that would affect his IRA/Trust account. Since the complainant never opened the account, he contacted Wells Fargo. They advised him that the account was opened in 2009, but no funds had been deposited nor had any transactions taken place.

HIT AND RUN CRASH: 06/12/16 - Oakbourne Road and S. Concord Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a one vehicle crash into a tree. When officers arrived at the scene they discovered an unoccupied gold colored Jaguar, with blood on the inside the vehicle and on the adjacent roadway. The vehicle sustained heavy front end damage with a broken front windshield. The reporting party advised that she had heard the crash and saw three subjects flee east on Oakbourne Road. Officers searched for the subjects with negative results. The vehicle registration was used to trace the owner who admitted to driving the car at the time of the crash. The owner was cited for careless driving and failure to notify police of an accident.

DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE / DRUG VIOLATION: 06/15/16 – 1500 Block of Overhill Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a domestic dispute. The reporting party advised officers that her grandmother had kicked her out of the home and would not allow her to return to collect her belongings. After speaking with the owner, she agreed to allow the reporting party into the residence to collect her belongings with a police escort. During the supervision of the escort, officers observed multiple pills fall to the floor as items were moved around. When asked about the pills, the party advised that she did not know to whom the pills belonged to. When officers took possession of the pills for identification, she claimed that her two year old son may have removed the pills from her grandmother's medicine cabinet. Officers located the medicine cabinet and identified that the pill bottles were on the third shelf and out of reach of a two year old child. The owner reported that nearly 50 of the pills (clonazepam) were missing. At this time her granddaughter was placed under arrest for possession of a controlled substance.

THORNBURY TOWNSHIP:

LOCATED DEMENTIA PATIENT: 06/01/16 – 900 Reisling Lane, Thornbury Township – An officer was dispatched to Reisling Lane for a well-being check of an elderly female, (who was located inside of the leasing office) and was reported to be disoriented and lost. Officers were advised that the female had walked into another resident's apartment and claimed that she resided there. When officers interviewed her, she was unable to provide much information. The officers then conducted a check through NCIC/CLEAN, which identified her as a missing person. Officers made contact with the woman's granddaughter, who had filed the report. She stated, both parties were staying at a hotel in Wilmington, Delaware, when the grandmother walked out of the hotel room. She advised that her grandmother suffers from dementia and she would like her evaluated at a local hospital. The grandmother was transferred to Chester County Hospital for evaluation.

PUBLIC DRUNKENNESS: 06/04/16 – Penn Oaks Drive and William Penn Boulevard, Thornbury Township – Officers were dispatched for the well-being check of a male lying on the side of the roadway. Upon arrival, the officers located a male sleeping in the

grass on the roadside of the intersection. The male was woken up and appeared to be intoxicated. The male had red and glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath and person. The male could not advise how he got to that location, stating he was drinking with his brother earlier in the night. After being transported to his residence, the subject was cited for Public Drunkenness.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 06/04/16 – Penn Oaks Golf Club, 150 Penn Oaks Drive, Thornbury Township – Owner reported that the golf course had been vandalized during the overnight hours. The damage was discovered when the ground crew was preparing the golf course for the day and observed multiple divots in the greens on the 13th, 14th, and 17th holes. The porta-potty, which is located near the sewage treatment station on the golf course, was also knocked over. It is believed that the actors obtained a golf wedge from the area of the storage building and used it to cause the damage.

PUBLIC DRUNKENNESS: 06/04/16 – Lukoil Gas Station, 1209 Wilmington Pike, Thornbury Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of an intoxicated employee at that location. DISTURBING THE PEACE: 06/10/16 – Penn Oaks Country Club, 150 Penn Oaks Drive, Thornbury Township – Officers were dispatched to a residence on South Concord Road for a noise complaint. The complainant indicated that he believed the noise was coming from the Penn Oaks Country Club and that he believed it was a loud party.
