EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP:

MENTAL HEALTH: 07/17/16 – 1000 Block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – A subject requested that a neighbor call for medical assistance because he was having mental health problems. He stated that he has recently been having visual hallucinations and paranoid thoughts. He advised that he has a history of this and that it has been exacerbated by smoking crack cocaine. He admitted to arming himself with a knife and scissors due to seeing dogs and believing that he will be attacked. The subject was transported to Chester County Hospital for evaluation.

FRAUD: 07/19/16 – 600 Block of Beaumont Circle, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he was the victim of check fraud. Victim advised officers that he had been notified by his bank that someone attempted to pass a fraudulent check in his name in the amount of \$36,500.00. He further advised that the bank was able to catch the fraudulent activity in time and no financial losses were sustained. The bank was provided with an incident number to allow them to proceed with their investigation.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 07/20/16 – 600 Block of Barker Drive, East Goshen Township – Officers were called for a report of a stop sign in the caller's driveway. On location, officers

discovered the sign was missing from northbound Barker Drive. The sign was replaced in the correct position and East Goshen Township was notified to check on the sign to make sure it was secure.

DISTURBANCE: 07/20/16 – 1100 Block of Princeton Lane, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched in reference to a previous dispute at the residence. The reporting party advised that she traveled to her late mother's house to collect some belongings. While going about her task, she began a verbal dispute with her sister, which became physical when her sister grabbed her arm. Officers spoke with the sister and confirmed this story. Neither party wished to pursue criminal charges; they told officers that they would remain civil while trying to decide on who receives certain items from their mother's house.

TRESPASSING: 07/20/16 – 1500 Block of Tanglewood Drive, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched to a pond in East Goshen Township for the report of 3 juveniles fishing in an area which is posted "no trespassing". Upon arrival, officers made contact with the juveniles and asked them to leave. All three were advised that the property was posted and no further action was taken.

DRUG VIOLATION: 07/21/16 – N Chester Road, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for the report of an 18 year old male that was jumping in the roadway and appeared to be intoxicated. Officers encountered the subject in front of the Goshen Village Shopping Center on Boot Road, and performed a pedestrian stop. While speaking with the male, officers observed the odor of alcohol on his person. At this time officers asked the male if he had anything illegal in his backpack. The male told police he did not have anything illegal and consented to have police look through to confirm. During the search officers discovered a Ziploc baggie that contained a white powder. When questioned the male identified the pills as crushed up Ritalin that he had borrowed from a friend. Goshen EMS was dispatched to check the male's vitals and to confirm he was able to be released safely after processing. After the screening, the male was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 07/21/16 – 2800 Block of Eagle Road, East Goshen Township – The reporting party advised officers that he had discovered damage to his deck that occurred overnight. He reported to officers that someone left a cigar on his deck and that it produced a burn mark. The reporting party believes that the damage may have been done intentionally as retaliation for recent events in the neighborhood.

FRAUD: 07/21/16 – 600 Block of Rexton Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident contacted the department regarding fraudulent emails. He advised that after he had closed on a new house at Sunset Lane, he received an email from a person who claimed to be employed by his realtor. The email stated that he had sent a bad check and asked him to wire a new one. The reporting party continued the email exchange but had a feeling that something was amiss, due to the other party declining any suggestion which did not involve an immediate money transfer. At that time, he called his realtor and discovered that the realtor had not made any contact with him. The reporting party was told to cease any contact with the fraudulent email account, and to call his bank to advise them of the situation. Investigation is ongoing.

DATING SCAM: 07/24/16 – 900 Block of Jefferson Way, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she wanted to report an online dating scam. The reporting party told officers that she had been using a dating website to have an online relationship with an unknown male. She advised officers that the male had asked her to purchase him a computer worth \$1688.16 and send it to an address in Cape Town, South Africa. The reporting party purchased the computer but when attempting to mail it, she was informed by a Fed EX employee that she may have been the victim of a scam. When she realized that it was a scam, she returned the computer and contacted police. Officers provided the victim with information about phone and online dating scams and advised her to avoid giving her financial information to anyone.

FRAUD: 07/26/16 – Brookmont Drive, East Goshen Township – Officers received reports of a computer fraud from the daughter of the victim. She advised officers that her father suffers from dementia, and that he was receiving calls at his home address from an unknown male. The male stated that the victim's computer was being targeted by a virus, and that to remove the virus, he would have to send him a cashier's check for \$2,800. The father did as directed and mailed a check to an address in Renton, Washington. Officers advised the daughter to change her father's email and phone number, to reduce the possibility of the man contacting him again. Additionally, she was advised to consult with an elder care attorney to help prevent similar incidents.

POSSESSION OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY: 07/26/16 – Waterview Apartments, 2 Waterview Road, East Goshen Township – Officers received reports of suspected child pornography being uploaded to the internet from East Goshen Township. The report received from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children indicated that an unknown subject utilized an IP address in West Chester to upload an Instagram video containing child pornography. The video file allegedly depicted a male child less than twelve years of age performing sexual acts on a goat. After tracking the Instagram account to its owner, detectives applied for search warrant to locate the device used to upload the video. When contact was made with the owner of the device, he admitted to uploading the video and stated that he received the video from a group chat that included relatives from the Dominican Republic and that he didn't think of the video as being child pornography. Police seized the phone and the owner provided the passcode for access. Investigation is pending the results of the phone imaging.

HARASSMENT: 07/26/16 – 1400 Block of Ardleigh Circle, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched to Ardleigh Circle for the report of a suspicious man soliciting in the neighborhood. The reporting party told officers that her daughter was home alone, and she called to tell her mother that a male was at the door soliciting, and that he had attempted to kiss her hand. While enroute to the location, officers encountered a male along the side of the road who matched the description of the subject. At this time, officers performed a pedestrian stop. When officers made contact with the victim, she reported to officers that the male had questioned her about her age, and attempted to enter her residence despite her being underage before grabbing her hand and kissing it. Officers escorted the victim to the scene to make a positive identification of the male. When questioned about his solicitation permit, the male he admitted he did not have one. The male was cited for harassment and soliciting without a permit.

DUI ARREST: 07/26/16 – West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Officers were monitoring the speed of traffic for westbound West Chester Pike. During this procedure, officers clocked the speed of a vehicle traveling at 65.8 MPH in a posted 45 MPH zone. At that time, officers conducted a traffic stop. While speaking with the male, officers observed signs of impairment (odor of alcohol, red and glassy eyes, and slurred speech). After field sobriety tests and a PBT, the male subject was determined to be under the influence of alcohol. The subject agreed to be transported to Chester County Hospital to provide blood for testing. Charges pending laboratory analysis.

FRAUD: 07/27/16 – 300 Block of Devon Way, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched on an assignment in regards to a scam. The reporting party told officers that she received a suspicious phone call from an unknown male, who advised her that she won 16 million dollars and a BMW. The male stated that she would have to send a check for \$1700.00 to him overnight to obtain the money. At this time she realized this was a scam and declined to provide any further information to the male. Officers confirmed that this was a scam and told her to never provide personal or financial information over the phone.

WARRANT SERVICE/DUI ARREST: 07/27/16 – 1300 Block of West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Officers received reports that a wanted subject was seen entering a silver vehicle parked in the parking lot of the Rose Hill Apartments. An officer who was on scene advised that the male was observed walking to the vehicle with a bottle of beer in his hand, and was now sitting in the vehicle. When officers arrived at the scene, they made contact with the driver of the vehicle. The male confirmed his identity and was told that he had a fugitive warrant for his arrest. The male was removed from the vehicle and placed in handcuffs. Officers were able to recover an open bottle of Corona Light from the driver's side door. While speaking to the male, officers observed the odor of alcohol on his person. After field sobriety tests and a PBT, it was determined that the male subject was under the influence of alcohol. At this time the male was charged with DUI and turned over to Chester County constables. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Victor JACKSON, M/35, West Chester, PA.**

FRAUD: 07/27/16 – Matlack Florist, 210 N Chester Road, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched in regards to a fraud report. The reporting party, an employee of Matlack Florist, informed officers that she received a suspicious phone call from an unknown male, who claimed that he was from PECO. The male indicated that the business' bill was past due and they would need to make a payment to prevent service interruption. After several minutes of speaking with the male, the employee began to suspect this may be a scam. At this time, she placed a phone call to PECO, and they advised her that there was no past due amount on the company bill and that the phone call was a scam.

FRAUD: 07/27/16 – 1200 Block of Rexton Drive, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched with regards to a fraud report. The reporting party advised that she was offered Trojan protection virus software by a company called Fiber World Services. The company claimed that her computer was infected with software and advised she could contact the company to have the virus removed. The reporting party did provide the company with her checking account information, so they could charge her \$199.99 for the virus cleaning

service. When the company attempted to cash the check, a bank representative recognized the scam and denied them access to the account. The reporting party spoke with a representative of the bank to close her account to prevent any further fraudulent charges. No financial loss was reported.

FRAUD: 07/29/16 – 1400 Block of Grand Oak Lane, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched regarding an identity theft. The reporting party advised officers that PECO notified him of a fraudulent account opened using his name and social security number. He has since had his name removed from the account without further issues. He advised officers of a similar situation last year with Comcast and was concerned a person was using his personal information to commit fraud. Officers told him to run a free credit report by using the FTC.GOV website to see if other open lines of credit were being used without his knowledge. He was told to contact police with any additional information.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 07/29/16 – 400 Block of Barker Drive, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for the report of a street sign found in the creek next to the caller's residence. On location officers were able to locate the street sign for Barker Drive and Brian Drive in the creek bed. Officers contacted East Goshen Township Public Works Department to advise them of the additional repair request.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 07/30/16 – Summit House, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone entered his vehicle during the overnight hours and removed a pair of Oakley Flak Jacket sunglasses, a LG Bluetooth headset, and twenty (20) blank checks. Due to the lack of damage to the exterior of the vehicle, it is highly probable that the vehicle was left unlocked.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 07/30/16 – Summit House, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that someone entered her unlocked vehicle during the overnight hours and removed approximately \$5 in change, a Citadel Debit Card, two compact discs, and a recyclable shopping bag with goat designs.

CRAIGS LIST SCAM: 07/30/16 – 1600 block of Herron Lane, East Goshen Township – Resident reported a possible Craigslist scam. The resident reported that her daughter placed an ad on Craigslist on her behalf for used furniture asking \$400. Her daughter then made a deal with someone to pick up the furniture on July 28th. However, the person sent a money gram in the amount of \$1950 and asked her to take \$1450 of that money and send another money gram to a delivery company so that the delivery company could pick up the furniture. On July 28th, her daughter sent the \$1450 money gram to the delivery company. When the daughter later arrived at her mother's house, she texted the person and asked where they were. The person responded saying their daughter has cancer and they would have to reschedule. Multiple texts were sent later, but the person responded by saying they would contact her with a pick-up date. On 07/30, the daughter received a check in the mail in the amount of \$1500 addressed to her. At that point, the mother and daughter both thought the situation to be suspicious and decided to make a police report.

ASSAULT: 07/31/16 – 1400 block of Patterson Lane, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a fight between two male subjects. While the officers were enroute, dispatched advised that the two males were brothers and that one had fled the scene in a

Honda Accord. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim and a female witness. The victim advised that the fight had started over people staying at the home while their parents were on vacation. One of the brothers (actor) returned to the home after dropping off a female friend who had spent the night at the home. When he arrived at the house, he began beeping the horn of his car in the driveway and sent a text message to the other brother (victim), telling him to move his car. When the brother (victim) didn't respond, the other brother (actor) entered the home through the garage and "went after" the female witness in the dining room of the home. He yelled "Get out of here" and "I'm going to kill you" and moved aggressively toward her with a crowbar in his hands. The brother (victim) moved to intervene between his brother (actor) and the female witness. The fight moved to the den of the home where the actor punched, kicked, hit (with crowbar) the other brother. The victim fell to the ground and sustained bruising and scratches to both arms and the left abdomen. As the fight continued, the victim pinned the actor to the floor and the witness called police. When the victim released the actor, he got up and fled the home. The actor was located and arrested on the following charges: Terroristic Threats, Simple Assault, and Harassment.

WESTTOWN TOWNSHIP:

IDENTITY THEFT/FRAUD: 07/16/16 – 1100 block of Wilmington Pike, Westtown Township – Resident reported that he was alerted through Credit Karma that there was derogatory mark on his credit history. When he investigated, he found it was for an unpaid \$461.73 Comcast bill that was sent to the Credit Bureau ERC. When he contacted Comcast, he was advised that he had an unpaid bill for an account opened in September of 2014 at an address in Wilmington, Delaware – where he has never lived. The resident filed the appropriate documents to declare that identity theft had occurred.

IDENTITY THEFT/FRAUD: 07/18/16 – 1000 block of Sage Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that she was contacted by a collection agency regarding an unpaid account through Comcast. She stated that an account was opened in November 2014 using her information and went into default in January 2015. The victim stated that she did not have Comcast during that time period and that the Comcast account she had prior to that was closed and paid in full. She advised that she has documentation showing her account was closed in good standing. The collection agency informed her that the amount owed was \$519.00 and the last four numbers of the social security number matched hers. The victim was advised to contact the three credit bureaus to determine if there was any other fraudulent activity being made using her information and to dispute any activity that was not made by her. She was also advised to contact her financial institutions and file the appropriate documents to notify them that her personal information had been compromised.

THEFT: 07/18/16 – 900 block of S Chester Road, Westtown Township – The victim, a resident of a group home, advised that he was to receive an envelope in the mail today from his uncle that contained \$40.00. However, he found that it had not been delivered. The victim spoke to another male that lives in the home and questioned him if he saw any mail addressed to him. The male advised him that an envelope was delivered and he remembered seeing it when he got the mail. The male stated that the occupants of the home take turns getting the mail and today was his turn. He stated that he saw the

envelope the victim was looking for and stated that he slid the envelope under the door to his bedroom. Both males gave me consent to look through their bedrooms, but I was unable to locate anything in the rooms. The victim was advised that he had no proof that the other male took the envelope, and the officer was unable to find anything in the trash that would show it was sent.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 07/20/16 – 1000 block of Plumly Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that he believed that his home was shot by "pellet" guns but did not see any actors in the area. The victim stated he was in his basement working when he heard some loud "banging" on the side of his house. He originally thought it may have been from squirrels running on the roof, but when he went outside he saw holes in his siding. The four holes, which were approximately 1/2 inch in diameter, were located next to his rear sliding door.

DISTURBANCE: 07/20/16 – Innovative Muscle Therapy, 1646 West Chester Pike, Westtown Township – A doctor associated with the practice reported that a patient had caused a disturbance at the business, and that he wanted assistance in ensuring that the patient understood that he was no longer welcome as a patient at the medical facility. The incident began when the patient arrived for an appointment. He was advised that he would have an extended wait time because the doctor had to leave the office for a family emergency. The patient seemed accepting initially when advised of the wait time. However, as the wait time grew, the subject became impatient and became irate with office staff, exclaiming that his situation was unacceptable. He began using obscene language, which offended other patients in the office. When the doctor arrived and attempted to speak with the patient, he was met with aggression. The subject began posturing at him in an aggressive manner. He then yelled at him, using obscene language. He stated that the patient began threatening that he would lose a considerable amount of patients and even began asking questions about his family. The doctor indicated that he no longer wanted the subject as a patient in the office, nor did he want to have contact with him outside of the office. The patient was contacted and advised that he had had a slight argument with the doctor and that the doctor acted weirdly. He advised that he would not be returning to the office again, but advised that he would not pay a bill if he received one from the doctor's office for that day's appointment.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT: 07/22/16 – 1400 block of Cider Knoll Way, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched to a report of a physical domestic between a male and a female. While officers were enroute, they were advised that the male had pushed the female to the ground. Upon arrival at the scene, officers were met by a family member who had witnessed the incident and advised that the male was inside the kitchen of the residence. As officers entered the open garage, they heard a male voice scream, "F*** you, b****!". They quickly began to enter the kitchen door from the garage and encountered the male subject. The male subject yelled, "Who the f*** are you?" at the officers and attempted to slam the door in their face. One of the officers was able to block the door with his foot and observed an elderly female lying on the floor. As officers entered the house, the male subject exited the residence through the rear door of the residence onto the patio. He was repeatedly ordered to stop by the officers but continued to walk at a fast pace through the back yard, stating "f*** the police". He refused repeated commands to stop and was advised that he would be tased if he did not stop. The subject

refused to comply and was tased and taken into custody. Further investigation indicated that the incident had occurred after the victim had asked the subject (her grandson) to help her bring groceries inside the residence. He refused and began to scream obscenities at her and the female witness. The incident then escalated and he threw the elderly victim across the kitchen and onto the floor. He also threw a portable phone in the kitchen, causing it to break. Preliminary medical evaluation by EMS at the scene indicated that the victim may have sustained multiple broken bones as a result of the attack; the subject was arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault and other related charges.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 07/23/16 – 1500 block of Manchester Court, Westtown Township – A couple reported that someone had entered their unlocked vehicles overnight and removed several items. The female victim discovered that her iPad had been stolen from a bag in the trunk of her Jeep. The iPad was a silver first generation iPad that contained family photos. Although she wasn't sure of the current value, she estimated it to be worth \$200.00. The male victim stated that numerous hand tools had been removed from the trunk of his vehicle. He estimated them to be worth \$200.00 and that the most expensive item was a Craftsman socket set, but the majority of the tools were old.

ATTEMPTED THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 07/23/16 – 1500 block of Manchester Court, Westtown Township – While investigating the above incident, the officer observed another vehicle that had an open trunk. The vehicle's interior looked as though it had been ransacked. Contact was made with the owner of the vehicle, who advised that it did not appear that anything was missing from the vehicle.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 07/23/16 – 1500 block of Manchester Court, Westtown Township – Resident reported that he discovered that someone had entered his unlocked vehicle overnight and removed money. The victim stated that he returned to the apartment complex at approximately 0300 hours and did not discover the theft until later in the afternoon the next day. Approximately \$80 in cash and approximately \$20 in loose change was removed from his vehicle.

ATTEMPTED THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 07/23/16 – 1500 block of Windermere Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that she discovered that someone had entered her unlocked vehicle during the overnight hours, but did not remove anything. She indicated that she discovered a Superman action figure sitting on the windshield of her vehicle that was parked to the rear of her apartment. The resident indicated that last night at 2230 hours, her dog was barking on the balcony of their apartment (which looks out to the rear of the apartment where the vehicle was parked). She believes that her dog scared the suspect(s) away at that time, but never actually saw anyone in the area.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 07/23/16 – 1507 Manchester Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that someone entered his unlocked vehicle overnight and removed two white I-Phone wall chargers missing from the vehicle.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 07/24/16 – 1500 block of Overhill Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that someone had placed pieces of cigarettes (unlit and burnt cigarette butts) all over her husband's truck. For example, cigarettes were stuck behind the license

plate, as well as into the driver's side mirror. The resident believes that she knows who did the vandalism, but cannot prove it. The previous day, she and her husband were driving in the truck on Overhill Road towards S. Chester Road. As they approached S. Chester Road, a landscaper abruptly entered the street from behind a bush - causing the vehicle to maneuver evasively in order to avoid hitting the subject. She believes that the landscaper, who resides nearby off of Route 352 vandalized the truck in retaliation for the incident.

DUI ARREST: 07/24/16 – Wilmington Pike at Skiles Boulevard, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched to assist Birmingham Police with a foot pursuit that was occurring at Route 202 and High Street. While officers were enroute, Birmingham advised that they now had one female in custody following a taser deployment, elaborating that they were on the northbound ramp to Route 202 from northbound Wilmington Pike. Birmingham Police also relayed that this incident was in reference to a hit and run accident that just occurred at the intersection of Wilmington Pike and Skiles Boulevard. Dispatch then advised that the struck vehicle was now calling in the same crash. Officer met with Birmingham Police who had the subject in custody. The subject was being combative while still on the ground as she continuously screamed at police. The Birmingham officer reported that while clearing a traffic stop at the aforementioned intersection, he observed a vehicle strike another vehicle that was stopped for a red traffic signal. The suspect vehicle then continued northbound on Wilmington Pike without stopping to render aid and/or provide information, at which time he began attempting to stop the suspect vehicle utilizing visual and audible warning signals. The suspect vehicle failed to stop for the officer as it continued northbound. As the suspect vehicle continued on the ramp from northbound Wilmington Pike onto northbound Route 202, it lost control and spun off the roadway coming to an uncontrolled rest in the bushes. The driver exited the vehicle and began running away from the vehicle, as well as from the officer who ordered her to stop. The driver continued to run from the officer until she was tased, at which point she was eventually taken into custody. The driver remained uncooperative and belligerent as she screamed profanities at police and continuously attempted to roll away and get up after several commands not to. EMS responded to treat the abrasions to the driver's shoulders and knee, but she continued to act in the same manner towards EMS personnel. At one point, she put her feet on the rear bumper of the ambulance and jumped off of it. The driver was then escorted by assisting police officers to the patrol vehicle, as she refused to walk and cooperate with police. Due to indications of impairment, the subject was arrested and charged with DUI. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Shauna SHERWIN, F/23, West Chester, PA.**

FRAUD: 07/26/16 – 1100 block of S. Chester Road, Westtown Township – Resident reported that his credit card was used fraudulently to purchase a \$559.50 ceiling fan. The purchase was made on-line from a company located in California and shipped to an address in North Carolina.

DUI ARREST: 07/27/16 – Wawa Food Market, 1501 West Chester Pike, Westtown Township – An officer on routine patrol observed a subject sitting in the driver's seat of a vehicle. The subject was acting in an unusual manner - staring straight forward, in a trance, and not moving at all. When the officer circled around the lot, he found that the subject was still sitting in the exact position. As a result, the officer exited his vehicle and approached the driver, asking if he was alright. At that time, the officer observed the male's

eyes, which were extremely red and glassy. The officer asked the subject was he was doing and the subject advised he was waiting for a friend in the store. During the conversation, the officer detected the odor of alcohol coming from the vehicle. Following the administration of field sobriety tests, the subject was placed under arrest for DUI.

ARRESTED SUBJECT: Matthew ELINKSY, M/22, Brookhaven, PA.

FORCIBLE RAPE: 07/27/16 – Westtown Township – Officers and detectives were dispatched for a report that an 11 year old male had sexually assaulted a 6 year old girl. The mother of the victim indicated on the previous day, a neighbor boy had asked her daughter if he could have sexual intercourse with her in exchange for giving her a pack of gum.
