Civil Matter: 1500 block Tanglewood Dr.

08/01/2016

Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 1500 block of Tanglewood Drive for a disturbance between the homeowner and a former care provider which occurred earlier in the day. The reporting party stated the care provider arrived at the residence in an attempt to obtain money that she believed was owed to her for previous services at which time a verbal argument ensued between the homeowner and the care provider. Officers spoke with the care provider over the phone who advised that she is owed \$800.00, but she was going to drop the matter and will not go back to the residence.

Suspicious Incident: Boot Rd. / Wilson Dr.

08/02/2016

Officers were dispatched to the area of Boot Road, west of Wilson Drive, for a suspicious white van which was pulled off to the side of the road occupied by an elderly male and an elderly female. Reports to responding officers indicated that there was also a Hispanic male in his twenties standing outside of the van pulling his jeans up and down and the elderly male was attempting to get the subject to enter the van. Upon officers arrival the van was no longer on location.

DUI: West Chester Pike / Westtown Way

08/02/2016

A certified Commercial Motor Carrier Inspection Officer was monitoring traffic in the area of West Chester Pike and Westtown Way at approximately 11:30 AM at which time a white pickup truck with an auto transport trailer was observed traveling eastbound on West Chester Pike. Disturbance: Communications Test Design, 1305 Goshen Parkway

08/02/2016

Officers were dispatched to 1305 Goshen Parkway (Communications Test Design) for a report of a disturbance. A disgruntled employee was refusing to leave the building.

Once on location officers spoke with the subject causing the disturbance who advised that he was there to pick up his pay check. The subject, who works for the company at their Coatesville location, stated he called and was told the check was at this office. A resident in the 1500 block of Mill Race Lane reported that they had responded to a Craigslist posting for a vacation rental house in California. The resident wired \$1350.00 from their bank account to another account as instructed. The victim later learned that the residence which they believed they were going to rent was for sale and the owner had not listed it as a rental. The incident was turned over to the department's Criminal Investigation Division for further investigation.

Suspicious incident: Goshen Fair, Goshen Fire Company, 1320 Park Ave.

08/03/2016

While on patrol at the Goshen Fair an officer on bike patrol detected the odor of burnt marijuana coming from a wooded area adjacent to the fairgrounds parking area. Upon investigating the odor further, the officer heard a group of individuals running from the area. The officer was able to make contact with a juvenile male who was observed running back to the area of the fairgrounds. Upon the officer checking the area further, the juvenile male fled from the area and out of the sight of the officer on bike patrol. The officer was able to make phone contact with the juvenile's mother and advised her of what had occurred.

An officer was dispatched to Racquet Club Apartments for a harassment complaint not in progress. Upon the officer meeting the reporting party, the reporting party stated another resident of Racquet Club Apartments called him a derogatory name and then spit on him. A guest of the Goshen Fair reported to an officer that a friend of theirs had run off the fairgrounds and may be suicidal. The officer obtained the name of the subject and contacted their mother. The subject's mother reported that their son was fine, did not wish to commit suicide, and that they just did not feel like attending the fair any further.

Officers on foot patrol at the Goshen Fair were alerted by fair patrons that two young females appeared to be separated from their parents. Officers were able to make contact with the two young girls and then were able to make contact with their mother. Upon speaking with their mother, officers observed that she was unsteady on her feet and appeared to be under the influence. The mother admitted to officers that she had taken two or three valiums prior to walking to the fairgrounds from her sister-in-law's residence at the Metropolitan Apartments, due to anxiety. Officers made contact with the sister-in-law of the mother and transported the mother and children to her residence at Metropolitan Apartments. After confirming that the children would be safe with the sister-in-law of the mother, they were released to her custody. Chester County Children Youth and Family were advised of the incident.

Robbery/Assault: 1308 West Chester Pike, Racquet Club Apartments

08-05-2016

On 8-5-2016 at 10:14 AM Officers were called to the Chester County Hospital's Emergency Room to speak with a victim who wished to report being robbed and assaulted earlier in the morning in the parking lot of Racquet Club Apartments, located at 1308 West Chester Pike. Upon speaking with the victim he reported that he was drinking alcohol with two acquaintances earlier in the evening at his residence in the Malvern area and was then driven to the parking lot of the Racquet Club Apartments by the two subjects. During this time, it was asked of the victim, by one of the subjects, that he be able to borrow \$100.00. The victim advised the officer that the subjects knew he had a large amount of cash in his possession from a Hispanic heritage lottery of sorts called a "Tanda". After refusing to lend the one subject the \$100.00 the victim was beaten and robbed of his wallet and money in the parking lot of Racquet Club Apartments. The victim advised the officer that after the two observed what they believed to be surveillance cameras in the parking lot, they stopped assaulting him. After further investigation by Westtown-East Goshen Police patrol officers and detectives, and with the assistance

of the East Whiteland Police Department, police arrested a juvenile male and an adult male. They were charged with Aggravated Assault, Robbery, and related charges.

Harassment by communication: 800 block Trout Run Dr.

08/05/2016

A resident of the 800 block of Trout Run Drive reported to police that his daughter and her friend posted a picture of an unknown celebrity on social media. Attached to the photo was the reporting party's daughter's cell phone number. Since posting the picture his daughter has been receiving harassing phone calls from unknown subjects. Additional information was requested from the reporting party so an investigation can take place.

Twp. Ordinance-Soliciting: 200 block Edith Lane

08/05/2016

While on patrol an officer observed a red Ford F150 pick-up truck driving slow in the 200 block of Edith Lane. The officer observed the occupants of the truck approach an elderly male subject and begin to solicit for driveway seal coating services. Department Detectives are investigating the theft of construction equipment from the Metropolitan Apartment Complex, located at 1323 West Chester Pike. While on patrol at the Goshen Fair a bike officer observed a group of juvenile males and females exit the bushes on the right side of the parking area, which is considered "out of bounds". Upon speaking with the group of juveniles the officer observed they were extremely nervous. It was determined that one of the male juveniles was in possession of a plastic water bottle that contained a blue liquid which the officer suspected to be alcohol. A portable breath test was administered to the male subject which was negative. The juvenile's parents were contacted and they were turned over to the custody of their parents.

A patron of the Goshen Fair reported that while riding on one of the rides she allowed the ride operator to take possession of her purse since she was not permitted to take it with her on the ride. After getting off of the ride and retrieving her purse she discovered that approximately \$20.00 was missing. By the time the victim notified the police of the incident the fair was over for the night and ride operator was no longer on location. On 8/6/2016 officers were able to identify the operator of the ride and questioned him about the theft. The operator of the ride admitted stealing \$20.00 from the victim's purse. Upon speaking with the owners of Majestic Midways it was agreed upon that the ride operator would return the money to the victim and that he no longer be permitted to work at the fair. The money

was returned to the victim. No charges were filed due to the ride operator returning home to South Africa in a couple of weeks.

Suspicious Vehicle: N. Chester Road / E. Boot Rd.

While on patrol an officer observed a suspicious occupied vehicle parked at the Plank House, located at N. Chester Rd. and E. Boot Rd. Due to the time of night the officer made contact with the occupant of the vehicle and determined that the subject was playing Pokemon. The subject was moved on from the area.

The caller told the victim that he was arrested in the Dominican Republic after being involved in a motor accident and needed \$1200.00. After speaking with other fraudulent actors depicting themselves as agents from the U.S. Embassy, she sent a

MoneyGram in that amount to a fraudulent agent. The care taker of the victim learned of this and contacted the U.S. Embassy in the Dominican Republic who advised her that this was indeed a scam. The officer provided the victim with information pertaining to be being a victim of a crime.

Criminal Mischief: 400 block Summit House

08/10/2016

A resident of Summit House reported that sometime overnight unknown individuals wrote profane language on the side of his truck using what appeared to be dirt. Due to these circumstances the officer requested the response of drug detection K-9 to his location. Upon the arrival of one of the Chester County Sheriff's K-9 handlers an exterior sniff of the vehicle being hauled was completed and the K-9 did alert to the driver's side of the vehicle along with the passenger side of the vehicle. Consent was then made to allow the officer to search the interior of the truck along with the vehicle being hauled. As a result of the search no contraband was located.

Theft: Wellington, 1361 Boot Rd.

An officer was dispatched a phone assignment to contact the daughter of a resident of Wellington, located at 1361 Boot Road, in reference to her mother's wallet being stolen from her room on 8-11-2016. Disturbance: 1100 block Talleyrand Rd.

08/04/2016

Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 1100 block of Talleyrand Rd. for a disturbance. Upon arrival at the residence the reporting party advised that she was at the residence to pick up her 16 year old daughter who was visiting a friend there. The reporting party stated that the mother at the residence was not permitting her daughter to leave the residence with her. The driver was ultimately charged with Recklessly Endangering Another Person, DUI, Possession of a Controlled Substance, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.
