POLICE INFORMATION FOR 09/16/16 – 09/30/16: The incidents indicated below are a summary of the significant investigations conducted by the department during the time period indicated.

IRS/TREASURY DEPARTMENT SCAM (Caller fraudulently claims that the victim has failed to pay taxes and that the IRS/Treasury Department has issued an arrest warrant and will be serving it immediately, unless the victim makes electronic payment):

EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP:

LOAN SCAM: 09/16/16 – 3300 block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he was looking to obtain a loan for \$15,000.00 and contacted an agency called MoneyLend@mail.com. The representative advised him that he needed to make a payment in advance in the amount of \$300. He was later advised that another payment for \$300 was required, and a third payment for \$272 would need to be sent via Western Union or via I-Tunes gift cards. The resident stated that he spoke to three different males during this process, and had multiple contact numbers for them. A male by the name John Green advised the resident that he was the CEO for the company and had made the \$15,000 available at Western Union. The resident was then advised to go to a local agent to retrieve his money. After going to a Western Union, he learned that Western Union does not deal with transfers of that amount. As a result, the resident contacted Green about getting his money, but continued running into dead ends.

MOVING COMPANY SCAM: 09/16/16 – Summit House, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – A resident advised that she moved from her one residence to another residence in West Chester in March of 2016. She used a moving company identified as "Prestige Movers," reported to be located at 1735 Market Street #3750, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Her furniture was picked up by employees of this company and was supposed to be stored in a storage unit belonging to this company. The resident advised

that she paid \$850 dollars for the initial cost of the move and the first month's rent consisting of \$169.00. Since this point, she has been making monthly payments of \$169.00 from March to August, consisting of a grand total amounting to \$1014.00, which did not include the initial cost of the move. The payments were processed using a "PayPal" account. The resident advised that she has been unable to speak with anyone from this company in over a week. When she called the company she receives an automated message stating "We are currently away from our desk." After several unsuccessful attempts to contact the company by telephone, she responded to the address which the company listed as their headquarters. At that time, the resident learned that this address does not exist in Philadelphia. She has sent multiple emails to the company requesting them to contact her about her furniture and the monthly September payment which was due, with negative results. Investigation is continuing.

ENDANGERED MISSING PERSON: 09/17/16 – Margo Lane, East Goshen Township – Representatives of the group home operated by Delta Community Support Inc. reported that a male patient had walked away from the facility. He was last seen leaving the residence and entering the woods to the rear of the property by one of the caretakers. The caretaker advised that he was the only caretaker present at the home and had a patient that he has to monitor constantly and therefore, he was unable to follow the patient who walked away from the facility. Responding units began searching the area and located the subject walking along N. Chester Rd at Margo Ln. He was returned to the facility. When questioned, he stated that he was going to walk to the Giant food store to give an employee a flower that he had picked.

SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE: 09/20/2016 – Meadow Drive, East Goshen Township - The police department was notified via a ChildLine Report of suspected child abuse. The mandated reporter indicated that the father of the victim is a patient of hers and he showed her a picture of bruises on his 14 year old daughter's arm. He indicated that the child's older sibling told him that the mother had injured the child because she was upset that the child had a job. The injuries occurred after the mother attempted to engage and provoke the child into an argument and then punched her several times (causing the bruises). Investigation is continuing.

SWEEPSTAKES SCAM: 09/20/16 – Bellingham Retirement Community, 1615 E. Boot Road, East Goshen Township – Resident of facility reported that he had received a phone call from "Publishers Clearing House" stating that he won 1 million dollars, but he had to send \$1,350 to a specific location to claim his prize. When the resident advised the male, (who spoke poor English) that he did not have that type of money, he was advised to take out a loan. The resident was advised that the call was a scam and further investigation indicated that the scam call originated in Jamaica.

GRANDPARENT SCAM: 09/21/16 – 600 block of Glenwood Lane, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she received a telephone call from someone claiming to be her grandson and asking for money to get out of jail. She knew that the call was a scam and immediately disconnected.

THEFT: 09/21/16 – Racquet Club Apartments, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that she believed that her roommate had stolen her cell phone that

afternoon. The subject, a Holcomb resident at the apartment complex, could not provide her roommate's last name.

HARASSMENT: 09/22/16- 1600 block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – The police department was contacted relative to an assault that had occurred two hours prior. Upon arrival at the scene, officers interviewed the two subjects (who are brothers). One subject indicated that he rents the apartment from a third party and has a valid lease until January of 2017. The problem occurred when the third party, who is having contractors work on the apartment, arrived at the apartment. The subject does not like the brothers and hasn't been shy about voice his desire to have the brothers removed from the residence, which cannot do due to the current lease. When the third party arrived, he began to use vulgar language toward one of the brothers and began pushing in an effort to get him out of the apartment. When the victim pulled away from the subject in an effort to not be pushed out of the apartment, the subject then punched him. When interviewed, the third party apologized and indicated that he had shoved the victim. The victim ultimately decided not to pursue criminal charges against the subject but will seek restitution for medical bills that he incurred as a result of the incident.

THEFT: 09/23/16 - Racquet Club Apartments, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Subject reported that someone stolen 45 pills of Ativan from her purse two days prior. She indicated that she and her roommate went to Rite Aide to pick up her prescription of Ativan. After receiving the medication, she placed them into her purse and went shopping with her roommate. When they returned to their apartment, she went to check in at the Holcomb Office. When she returned to her apartment, she discovered that the medication was missing. She then reported this incident to the Holcomb staff, who searched her entire apartment and were unable to locate the prescription. The subject indicated that she believed that her roommate stole the medication. Holcomb staff were interviewed and they indicated that this is a common occurrence for the two roommates to accuse each other of stealing items (see above incident).

THEFT: 09/23/16 – Wellington, E. Boot Road, East Goshen Township - Resident of facility reported that she had approximately \$350 stolen from her purse six days prior. The victim stated that at approximately 5:00 pm, she and her husband went down to the 1st floor for dinner at Wellington Hall. She left her purse, which contained her wallet and at least \$350.00 in assorted U.S. currency on a stool inside their apartment. When they returned from dinner at around 6:30 pm, her purse was still in the same location on the stool. However, the next day they traveled to Cape May and she discovered that the money was missing when she reached into her wallet to pay for lunch. Investigation is continuing.

DISTURBANCE: 09/24/2016 – Racquet Club Apartments, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Officers received a report of a disturbance from two Holcomb residents who are roommates (see two above incidents). One roommate indicated that they had become involved in an argument after one subject refused to wash her pots after she was done using them. Holcomb staff was contacted to settle the argument.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 09/24/16 – Rose Hill Estates, 1324 West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Subject reported that he was visiting his niece, who is a resident of the complex, and parked his vehicle in the parking lot. When he left her apartment that

evening, he observed a long scratch on the rear driver's side of the vehicle. The scratch was described as a key scratch. The victim indicated that he believed that the damage would cost \$300 to repair.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE / SIMPLE ASSAULT - 09/25/16 – 1700 block of Valley Drive, East Goshen Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a domestic dispute, reported to be a physical male vs. male fight. As officers were enroute, CCPR advised that the reporting party was fighting with his girlfriend and his girlfriend's son. Upon arrival, officers observed that the complainant had not visible injuries but was reporting head and back pain. The investigation indicated that the incident began after the girlfriend advised her boyfriend that her ex-husband would be dropping off her son at the apartment. Her boyfriend became upset, walked to the closet, picked up an axe, and then sat back down on the couch. He then told his girlfriend that if her ex-husband walked into the house, he was going to kill him. She then ran outside and advised her ex-husband and son of what had occurred. While she was outside, her boyfriend took her purse and cigarettes and locked himself inside the back bedroom. The boyfriend later exited the bedroom and a verbal argument ensued in which he threw a soda can at the son. When the mother intervened between the two, her boyfriend pushed her out of the way, knocking her into the wall and onto the couch in the living room. He then tackled the son to the ground. The son then pushed him off, causing him to fall back into the fireplace. Based upon the physical evidence at the scene and the recent physical injury sustained by the mother and son (as well as an outstanding warrant for the boyfriend), the boyfriend was arrested for Simple Assault and related charges.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 09/26/16 – Summit House, West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that two days prior, he observed damage to his vehicle. He observed a white mark on his black vehicle. The white mark was very low on his front bumper and believes it may be from a child's bicycle tire.

THEFT FROM VEHICLE: 09/26/16 – YMCA, 605 Airport Road, East Goshen Township – Victim reported that sometime during the evening hours someone entered his unlocked vehicle, which was parked in the YMCA parking lot, and removed a laptop bag with an HP laptop inside (valued at \$2,000.00).

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 09/26/16 - YMCA, 605 Airport Road, East Goshen Township – While investigating the above incident, the officer interviewed a witness. The witness indicated that she had observed a subject (light skinned white male, about 5'8", large build, approximately 30 years of age with close cut hair) holding an object and making a striking motion against the window of another vehicle. When the subject observed the witness sitting in her vehicle near him, he ran toward the wooded area near the parking lot. The second vehicle sustained damage to its window. It appears that the actor was using a window punch or an object similar in nature. The vehicle's window indicated five strikes in close proximity that chipped the window, but the actor was unable to shatter the glass to get the purse that was on the front passenger's seat.

ROAD RAGE INCIDENT: 09/27/16 – 1300 block of West Chester Pike, East Goshen Township – Subject reported that a driver of another vehicle pointed a gun at her while they were driving in the 1300 block of West Chester Pike. The subject reported that the

other driver (a white, heavy set male, in his late 30's or early 40's with dark hair and a beard) pulled alongside her and accused her cutting him off. The male then proceeded to call her various profanities before pulling away. As both vehicles continued down West Chester Pike, the driver of the other vehicle swayed back and forth in and out of his lane as if he was going to hit her vehicle. At some point, the male reached into his lap and pulled out what she believed to be a gun. The subject stated that she only called the police because she was scared and did not want to pursue criminal charges. The other subject was identified and interviewed. He stated that he observed a vehicle cutting off other cars on West Chester Pike – including his vehicle. At one traffic, the subject stated the male passenger of that vehicle was looking back and laughing at him. He believed that the driver and the passenger were doing this on purpose. As a result, he confronted the occupants of the other vehicle, exchanging verbal profanities and displaying his middle finger. However, he denied displaying a firearm. Since neither party wants to pursue criminal charges, nor could positivity identify if a firearm was displayed, this investigation was closed.

GRANDPARENT SCAM: 09/28/16 – Inverness Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he received a phone call from a male subject stating he was his grandson and that he was in trouble. After questioning the male, the resident realized this was a grandparent scam and disconnected the phone call.

CHECK FRAUD: 09/29/16 – Dickens Drive, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that he noticed four (4) fraudulent checks cashed from his account that he did not authorize. The checks were cashed on 09/14/16 for \$955.76, 09/15/16 for \$859.00, 09/16/16 for \$960.00, and 09/18/16 for \$1200.00. The victim believes his checking account became compromised on September 7th, 2016 when he placed a \$3,750.00 check into his mailbox to a company. The victim became suspicious when he was notified that this check was never received by the company.

MISSING JUVENILE: 09/29/16 – Valley Youth House, Reservoir Road, East Goshen Township – Employees of the youth facility reported that a female juvenile assigned to the facility failed to show for school today and had not been seen or heard from since 0710 hours. While investigating the missing child, the officer was advised that the facility had just spoken with the juvenile who advised that she had been at the King of Prussia Mall and would be returning shortly. Upon her arrival, the juvenile was interviewed and stated that she just didn't feel like going to school that day.

BURGLARY: 09/30/16 – Zephyr Hill, East Goshen Township – Resident reported that 30 minutes prior, she heard two loud bangs. She looked outside and saw a male (white male, approximately 35-40 years old, average height/weight/build, with short dark and "thinning" hair) walking away from the front door of her neighbor's residence and quickly entering a vehicle (black or dark gray SUV). Since her neighbor has been visiting a relative in another state, she went outside to investigate. At that time, she observed that part of her neighbor's front door was on the ground and realized that the bangs must have been someone forcing their way into the residence. As a result, she contacted Security. Investigation is continuing.

WESTTOWN TOWNSHIP:

DISTURBANCE: 09/16/16 – Ridge Road, Westtown Township – An officer was dispatched to a report of a disturbance in progress. The reporting party advised that a student was refusing to get the bus and was blocking the roadway, so the bus could not leave. Upon arrival at the scene, the officer made contact with the bus driver. He advised that the student, who has special needs, would not get on the bus for the second day in a row. The officer then responded to the residence and spoke with the student’s mother. The mother indicated that she was attempting to calm her daughter and did not need assistance.

THEFT: 09/16/16 – Rustin High School, 1100 Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – School officials reported that someone removed a iPhone 6s cell phone from an unsecured locker in the girls’ locker room during the afternoon hours. When the student activated the Find My iPhone application, the application indicated that the last location of the cell phone was at a specific address on Dilworthtown Road. The student then used Google to determine that the address belonged to another student. The student then contacted the student’s mother via email. The two parties exchanged emails in an attempt to get the cell phone back with negative results. The school became aware of the incident when the second student came to the office of a school official and informed him that she didn’t steal the phone and was being accused of the crime by the other student.

TRESPASSING: 09/17/16 – Rustin High School, 1100 Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a trespassing complaint of dirt bikes being driven on the property. On arrival in the area, officers checked the Plumly Farm development and located a group of juveniles in the 1000 block of Plumly Drive. The children were wearing riding gear and were standing near dirt bikes. Contact was made with the juveniles and they admitted to riding on the property. After identifying the subjects, the three were advised of the complaint and advised that if there were any damages reported they would be responsible for paying restitution.

TRESPASSING: 09/18/16 – Oakbourne Road and Sage Road, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of dirt bikes and ATVs being ridden on Township property. On arrival in the area, the officer observed a dirt bike being ridden in the 900 block of Sage Road. Once the rider observed the police car, he fled the scene heading towards Oakbourne Road. The officer then made contact with the homeowner. The homeowner advised that his children owned dirt bikes and that the property belonged to Westtown Township. He was advised that if the department received another complaint of trespassing, he would be receiving citations.

SWEEPSTAKES SCAM: 09/19/16 – Bobolink Lane, Westtown Township – Resident reported that he received a call from a subject who identified himself as Anthony Brown. “Brown” stated he was working for the F.B.I. and provided his work address and telephone number. “Brown” advised the resident that he had won 8 million dollars and would be receiving a call from his supervisor later in the day. The resident immediately recognized this as a scam and contacted the police.

INTERNET DATING/BLACKMAIL SCAM: 09/20/16 – Carolyn Drive, Westtown Township – Resident (a 25 year old male) reported that he has a profile set up on the Plenty of Fish website and recently began speaking with an 18 year old female who did not list her name. He stated that the conversations were "typical" and they talked about whatever topics came to mind (nothing inappropriate). Over this past weekend, he received a message from the Plenty of Fish female stating that she was in fact 16 years old. After receiving this text, he told the female to leave him alone. During the weekend, he also received a text message that asked him when they were going to New York again. Since he had just spent the weekend there with friends and met several women, he assumed that the message was from one of those females. The text message then asked, "What would we do?" and then "I'm not afraid of sex". The resident became suspicious of who was sending the text message so he asked the female to send a picture of herself so that he would know who he was speaking with. The female replied by sending him several nude pictures. He responded by sending a picture of his penis. Later, he received a telephone call from the same number and the female starts asking him questions that clearly indicate that she knows where he works. The resident became suspicious of who was calling and hung up the telephone; he received additional calls from the same number, but he did not answer. Several days later, while in a meeting at work, he received numerous phone calls from the very same number. He stated that he did not answer. A voicemail was left for him, it was a male claiming to be the father of the "16 year old" from Plenty of Fish. He stated that the resident had two minutes to return the telephone call or he was calling the authorities. The resident stated that he called the number and spoke with the "father." The "father" yelled at him, exclaiming that he was going file charges. The "father" began stating things from his profile that didn't exist (i.e., he was looking for underage girls and such). The "father" told the resident that he needed to go to Walmart or nearest Western Union to wire \$826.00 so that he may turn off the service to his "daughter's" phone. He was advised to call the "father" at the "daughter's" number when he arrived so that he could provide him with the transaction numbers. The resident was advised that this was a blackmail scam.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: 09/21/16 - 500 block of Leslie Lane, Westtown Township – Resident reported that someone damaged her mailbox during the overnight hours. The resident reported that the mailbox had been struck by a vehicle, causing the mailbox to fall onto the driveway and the wooden post to break near the top. Estimated value to replace the mailbox and post is \$150.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE / SIMPLE ASSAULT: 09/21/16 – Picket Way, Westtown Township – A resident came in the station to file a report regarding an ongoing domestic situation. The resident stated that she and her husband have been having marital problems and he has been verbally abusive towards her, but it has been getting progressively worse. She stated that on 09/18/16, during the early morning hours, a severe incident had occurred. Her husband, who had been drinking and fallen asleep on the downstairs couch, came to the bedroom and began screaming at her. He then went back downstairs and threw a small dog gate from the foyer to the upstairs landing. She took the gate back down and asked him what was wrong, and then stated that he then took a small candle and hit her in the face with it. Upon her arrival, the officer observed that the resident still had dried blood under her right nostril, but no other injuries visible. The subject stated that she has now realized that something needs to be done and was looking for advice. The officer explained the process on filing for a PFA and inquired if she

wished to file for an emergency PFA at the time. She advised that she would go to the court house first thing in the morning to file the paperwork and would consider an emergency PFA if something occurred later in the evening.

THEFTS: 09/22/16 – Rustin High School, Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – School officials reported that an unknown subject(s) entered the team room of the cross country team and removed multiple items from students' unsecured lockers. Stolen items included: 2 Wells Fargo debit cards, \$150.00 cash, a blank bank check, a black iPhone 6, a silver iPhone 6, and a Discover credit card.

DUI ARREST: 09/23/16 – Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – An officer, who was assigned to a stationary position near Rustin High School, observed a vehicle traveling south on Shiloh Road at an estimated speed above 30 mph (during an active school zone period). The officer attempted to stop the vehicle by activating his emergency lights and siren, but the operator did not acknowledge the lights and sirens for an extended period of time. It wasn't until a distance of approximately 1/2 mile that the operator pulled over on the shoulder of the roadway. Upon making contact with the operator, the officer detected the odor of burnt marijuana. The driver also exhibited indications of impairment (glassy eyes, delayed responses to all questions, etc.). A small amount of marijuana and a device to smoke marijuana were located inside the vehicle. Following the performance of field sobriety tests, the subject was placed under arrest for DUI. **ARRESTED SUBJECT: Alan WINKS, M/47, West Chester, PA.**

UNDERAGE DRINKING: 09/23/16 – Rustin High School, Shiloh Road, Westtown Township – School officials reported 3 students were suspected of consuming alcohol at the football game that was underway. One member of the faculty reported that he observed all three students passing a plastic Gatorade bottle between themselves and drinking out of the bottle. When he checked the bottle, it smelled like vodka. The parents of the three students, who are females between the age of 15 and 16 years old, were contacted. After the administration of a PBT test, the decision was made to cite only one of the three students. However, all three students will face discipline through the school for violating school policy.

DUI ARREST: 09/28/16 – Giant Food Store, 1502 West Chester Pike, Westtown Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a vehicle being driven erratically in the parking lot of the store; witnesses observed the burgundy Jeep running into curbs in the shopping center parking lot in front of the Giant Food Market and Citizens Bank. Upon arrival at the scene, the officers observed the Jeep stopped in front of a line of vehicles. The Jeep was angled as though it was going to turn right onto eastbound West Chester Pike. The traffic signal was red for traffic exiting the parking lot. The officers waited on the shoulder of eastbound West Chester Pike, east of the exit for the shopping center, for the Jeep to pass. When the light turned green, the Jeep began to turn right onto West Chester Pike. But rather than turn into the eastbound lanes, the Jeep drove over the median and into the westbound lanes traveling eastbound. The vehicle then drove back onto the median. The officers activated their emergency lights and siren to attempt to have the vehicle stop, following in the left eastbound lane of West Chester Pike. The Jeep accelerated and struck two traffic signs that were also in the median. The Jeep then stopped in the middle of the intersection for N. Chester Road and West Chester Pike.

When officers approached the vehicle, they observed indications of severe impairment. The male driver was seen to be staring straight forward and swaying his upper body back and forth, and side to side. It was also noticed that the driver's eyes were red and glassy. Upon speaking with the operator, the officers noted that his speech was very slurred. Additionally, the officers observed a bottle of vodka underneath the driver's seat. The officers assisted the driver in exiting his vehicle because he was very unsteady on his feet. Following the administration of a PBT test, the subject was placed under arrest for DUI.
ARRESTED SUBJECT: Thomas J. CHRISTENSON, M/58, West Chester, PA.

THORNBURY TOWNSHIP:

REPORT OF SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE: 09/19/16 – Stone Fence Road, Thornbury Township - The police department was notified via a ChildLine Report of suspected child abuse. Mother reported that one of her two children had injuries from their father, from whom she is separated. The child had 2 small bruise marks on his lower left back. Mother made the report after the child told her that the father had been "too rough" with the child. Mother said that she believes that the father hit the child and the child felt that it was on purpose. The father denied intentionally causing the marks. He stated that the children "mix it up" when playing around and the child sometimes falls down. During her interview, the mother stated that her children returned from a visit with their father and that she was reviewing Roses and Thorns (highs and lows) of the visit with their father that was video recorded. During the video, one of her sons stated that his back hurt where his father had hit him. When she spoke to her estranged husband, he stated that one of the sons was agitating his younger brother. When he told him to stop, he continued to engage in the behavior so he hit him on the back. The incident was listed as unfounded by CYF and the investigation will be closed.

THEFT: 09/23/16 – Clothes Mentor, 1369 Dilworthtown Crossing, Thornbury Township – Store Manager reported that a customer sold a used Jimmy Choo wallet to the Clothes Mentor. After the sale was complete and Clothes Mentor gave her \$17 for the wallet, the Clothes Mentor observed the wallet to be a fake/ counterfeit Jimmy Choo brand. Clothes Mentor attempted multiple times to contact the subject and have not been able to make contact, however, have left multiple voicemail messages.

SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE: 09/23/16 – Stone Fence Road, Thornbury Township – The police department was notified via a ChildLine Report of suspected child abuse. School staff advised that the mother of two children at the school had reported to them that the children's father became aggressive towards them and caused injury to them. One child reportedly had a bruise on his face and scratch on his neck and the other child had a bruise on his back and on his chest that were caused by his father. The mother also reported that the father held one of the two children down and said you 'f***** ass'. The mother told the school that the father then felt remorseful afterwards and broke down crying in his room. The children are currently with their mother, but the father is contracted as a guardian ad litem through the county agency and referral will be need to be made to the regional office per the Chester County CYC. Investigation is continuing.

RETAIL THEFT: 09/25/16 – Giant Food Store, 1393 Dilworthtown Crossing, Thornbury Township – Officers were dispatched for a report of a Retail Theft in progress. An Asset

Protection Officer stated a white male wearing a red flannel shirt was observed pushing a cart of unpaid merchandise out of the store. The Asset Protection Officer approached the subject, who was attempting to load the stolen merchandise into a gray Nissan Altima bearing Delaware registration. The car was also occupied by a white male driver (wearing a blue Tommy Hilfiger shirt) and a black male (with an unknown description) in the passenger seat. When the Asset Protection Officer identified who he was to the subject, who was being assisted by the driver of the vehicle with unloading the merchandise, the subject left all of the merchandise in the cart and fled northbound on SR 202 in the car. Attempts by officers to locate the vehicle met with negative results. The total amount of stolen merchandise was \$219.86. Investigation is continuing.

WEST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP:

MEDICAL EMERGENCY: 09/28/16 – Southbound Route 202 at the Boot Road overpass, West Goshen Township – Two members of the Criminal Investigation Division were traveling southbound on Route 202 when they observed a white vehicle in the left travel lane slowing down and pulling to the median, before coming to a stop. As the detectives approached the vehicle, they observed that the driver of the vehicle was slumped over in the driver’s seat. The detectives stopped to check on the driver and discovered that the subject was experiencing a medical emergency. The detectives performed CPR on the driver, who was in cardiac arrest, until the arrival of Goshen Ambulance and Medic 91 arrived and relieved them. Unfortunately, the subject did not survive.
